AN ACT in relation to alcohol liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by 5 changing Section 6-15 as follows:

6 (235 ILCS 5/6-15) (from Ch. 43, par. 130)

Sec. 6-15. No alcoholic liquors shall be sold 7 or 8 delivered in any building belonging to or under the control of the State or any political subdivision thereof except as 9 provided in this Act. The corporate authorities of any city, 10 incorporated town or township may provide 11 village, by ordinance, however, that alcoholic liquor may be sold or 12 13 delivered in any specifically designated building belonging to or under the control of the municipality or township, or 14 15 in any building located on land under the control of the 16 municipality; provided that such township complies with all applicable local ordinances in any incorporated area of the 17 18 township. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at 19 any airport belonging to or under the control of a municipality of more than 25,000 inhabitants, or in 20 any building or on any golf course owned by a park district 21 22 organized under the Park District Code, subject to the approval of the governing board of the district, or in any 23 building or on any golf course owned by a forest preserve 24 25 district organized under the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act, subject to the approval of the governing board 26 27 of the district, or on the grounds within 500 feet of any building owned by a forest preserve district organized under 28 the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act during times when 29 food is dispensed for consumption within 500 feet of the 30 building from which the food is dispensed, subject to the 31

1 approval of the governing board of the district, or in a 2 building owned by a Local Mass Transit District organized under the Local Mass Transit District Act, subject to the 3 4 approval of the governing Board of the District, or in 5 Bicentennial Park, or on the premises of the City of Mendota Lake Park located adjacent to Route 51 in Mendota, Illinois, 6 or on the premises of Camden Park in Milan, Illinois, or 7 in the community center owned by the City of Loves Park that is 8 9 located at 1000 River Park Drive in Loves Park, Illinois, or, in connection with the operation of an established food 10 11 serving facility during times when food is dispensed for consumption on the premises, and at the following aquarium 12 and museums located in public parks: Art Institute of 13 Chicago, Chicago Academy of Sciences, Chicago Historical 14 15 Society, Field Museum of Natural History, Museum of Science 16 and Industry, DuSable Museum of African American History, John G. Shedd Aquarium and Adler Planetarium, or at Lakeview 17 Museum of Arts and Sciences in Peoria, or in connection with 18 19 the operation of the facilities of the Chicago Zoological Society or the Chicago Horticultural Society on land owned by 20 21 the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, or on any land 22 used for a golf course or for recreational purposes owned by 23 the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, subject to the District 24 control of the Forest Preserve Board of 25 Commissioners and applicable local law, provided that dram shop liability insurance is provided at maximum coverage 26 limits so as to hold the District harmless from all financial 27 loss, damage, and harm, or in any building located on land 28 owned by the Chicago Park District if approved by the Park 29 30 District Commissioners, or on any land used for a golf course or for recreational purposes and owned by the Illinois 31 32 International Port District if approved by the District's governing board, or at any airport, golf course, faculty 33 34 center, or facility in which conference and convention type

1 activities take place belonging to or under control of any 2 State university or public community college district, provided that with respect to a facility for conference and 3 4 convention type activities alcoholic liquors shall be limited to the use of the convention or conference participants or 5 participants in cultural, political or educational activities 6 7 held in such facilities, and provided further that the 8 faculty or staff of the State university or a public 9 community college district, or members of an organization of students, alumni, faculty or staff of the State university or 10 11 a public community college district are active participants in the conference or convention, or in Memorial Stadium on 12 the campus of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign 13 during games in which the Chicago Bears professional football 14 15 team is playing in that stadium during the renovation of 16 Soldier Field, not more than one and a half hours before the start of the game and not after the end of the third quarter 17 of the game, or by a catering establishment which has rented 18 facilities from a board of trustees of a public community 19 college district, or, if approved by the District board, on 20 21 land owned by the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago and leased to others for a term of at least 20 years. 22 23 Nothing in this Section precludes the sale or delivery of alcoholic liquor in the form of original packaged goods in 24 25 premises located at 500 S. Racine in Chicago belonging to the University of Illinois and used primarily as a grocery store 26 by a commercial tenant during the term of a lease that 27 predates the University's acquisition of the premises; but 28 29 the University shall have no power or authority to renew, 30 transfer, or extend the lease with terms allowing the sale of alcoholic liquor; and the sale of alcoholic liquor shall be 31 subject to all local laws and regulations. After the 32 acquisition by Winnebago County of the property located at 33 404 Elm Street in Rockford, a commercial tenant who sold 34

1 alcoholic liquor at retail on a portion of the property under 2 a valid license at the time of the acquisition may continue to do so for so long as the tenant and the County may agree 3 4 under existing or future leases, subject to all local laws and regulations regarding the sale of alcoholic liquor. 5 Each 6 facility shall provide dram shop liability in maximum 7 insurance coverage limits so as to save harmless the State, 8 municipality, State university, airport, golf course, faculty 9 center, facility in which conference and convention type activities take place, park district, Forest Preserve 10 11 District, public community college district, aquarium, museum, or sanitary district from all financial loss, damage 12 or harm. Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings 13 of golf courses owned by municipalities in connection with 14 15 the operation of an established food serving facility during 16 times when food is dispensed for consumption upon the premises. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at 17 retail in any building owned by a fire protection district 18 organized under the Fire Protection District Act, provided 19 that such delivery and sale is approved by the board of 20 21 trustees of the district, and provided further that such 22 delivery and sale is limited to fundraising events and to a 23 maximum of 6 events per year.

Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold at retail 24 25 in the Dorchester Senior Business Center owned by the Village of Dolton if the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only 26 in connection with organized functions for which the planned 27 attendance is 20 or more persons, and if the person or 28 29 facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has 30 provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Village of Dolton and the State from 31 all financial loss, damage and harm. 32

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retailin any building used as an Illinois State Armory provided:

(i) the Adjutant General's written consent to the
 issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such
 building is filed with the Commission;

4 (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only
5 in connection with organized functions held on special
6 occasions;

7 (iii) the organized function is one for which the
8 planned attendance is 25 or more persons; and

9 (iv) the facility selling or dispensing the 10 alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability 11 insurance in maximum limits so as to save harmless the 12 facility and the State from all financial loss, damage or 13 harm.

14 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail 15 in the Chicago Civic Center, provided that:

16 (i) the written consent of the Public Building 17 Commission which administers the Chicago Civic Center is 18 filed with the Commission;

19 (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only 20 in connection with organized functions held on special 21 occasions;

(iii) the organized function is one for which theplanned attendance is 25 or more persons;

(iv) the facility selling or dispensing the
alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability
insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the
Civic Center, the City of Chicago and the State from all
financial loss, damage or harm; and

29 (v) all applicable local ordinances are complied30 with.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered or sold in any building belonging to or under the control of any city, village or incorporated town where more than 75% of the physical properties of the building is used for commercial or

1 recreational purposes, and the building is located upon a 2 pier extending into or over the waters of a navigable lake or stream or on the shore of a navigable lake or stream. 3 4 Alcoholic liquor may be sold in buildings under the control of the Department of Natural Resources when written consent 5 6 to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such 7 buildings is filed with the Commission by the Department of Natural Resources. Alcoholic liquor may be served or 8 9 delivered in buildings and facilities under the control of 10 the Department of Natural Resources upon the written approval of the Director of Natural Resources acting as the 11 controlling government authority. The Director of Natural 12 13 Resources may specify conditions on that approval, including but not limited to requirements for insurance and hours of 14 15 operation. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, 16 alcoholic liquor sold by a United States Army Corps of Engineers or Department of Natural Resources concessionaire 17 who was operating on June 1, 1991 for on-premises consumption 18 19 only is not subject to the provisions of Articles IV and IX. Beer and wine may be sold on the premises of the Joliet Park 20 District Stadium owned by the Joliet Park District when 21 written consent to the issuance of a license to sell beer and 22 23 in such premises is filed with the local liquor wine commissioner by the Joliet Park District. Beer and wine may 24 25 be sold in buildings on the grounds of State veterans' homes when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell 26 beer and wine in such buildings is filed with the Commission 27 by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, and the facility 28 29 shall provide dram shop liability in maximum insurance 30 coverage limits so as to save the facility harmless from all financial loss, damage or harm. Such liquors may be delivered 31 32 to and sold at any property owned or held under lease by a Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority or Metropolitan 33 34 Exposition and Auditorium Authority.

1 Beer and wine may be sold and dispensed at professional 2 sporting events and at professional concerts and other entertainment events conducted on premises owned by the 3 4 Forest Preserve District of Kane County, subject to the control of the District Commissioners and applicable local 5 law, provided that dram shop liability insurance is provided 6 7 at maximum coverage limits so as to hold the District 8 harmless from all financial loss, damage and harm.

9 Nothing in this Section shall preclude the sale or 10 delivery of beer and wine at a State or county fair or the 11 sale or delivery of beer or wine at a city fair in any 12 otherwise lawful manner.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in State parks under the control of the Department of Natural Resources, provided:

a. the State park has overnight lodging facilities
with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight
lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve
complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,

20 b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell 21 alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with 22 the commission by the Department of Natural Resources, 23 and

the alcoholic liquors are sold by the State park 24 с. 25 lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight. from 11 26 Notwithstanding any other provision of this 27 Act, alcoholic liquor sold by the State park or restaurant 28 29 concessionaire is not subject to the provisions of 30 Articles IV and IX.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings on properties under the control of the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum provided: a. the property has overnight lodging facilities
 with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight
 lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve
 complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,

5 b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell 6 alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with 7 the commission by the Historic Sites and Preservation 8 Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the 9 Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, and

10 c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the lodge or 11 restaurant concessionaire only during the hours from 11 12 o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight.

The sale of alcoholic liquors pursuant to this Section 13 does not authorize the establishment and operation 14 of facilities commonly called taverns, saloons, bars, cocktail 15 16 lounges, and the like except as a part of lodge and restaurant facilities in State parks or golf courses owned by 17 Forest Preserve Districts with a population of less 18 than 19 3,000,000 or municipalities or park districts.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in the Springfield Administration Building of the Department of Transportation and the Illinois State Armory in Springfield; provided, that the controlling government authority may consent to such sales only if

a. the request is from a not-for-profitorganization;

b. such sales would not impede normal operations ofthe departments involved;

c. the not-for-profit organization provides dram
shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits and
agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State
of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm;

d. no such sale shall be made during normal workinghours of the State of Illinois; and

## e. the consent is in writing.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in recreational areas of river conservancy districts under the control of, or leased from, the river conservancy districts. Such sales are subject to reasonable local regulations as provided in Article IV; however, no such regulations may prohibit or substantially impair the sale of alcoholic liquors on Sundays or Holidays.

9 Alcoholic liquors may be provided in long term care facilities owned or operated by a county under Division 5-21 10 11 or 5-22 of the Counties Code, when approved by the facility operator and not in conflict with the regulations of the 12 Illinois Department of Public Health, to residents of the 13 facility who have had their consumption of the alcoholic 14 liquors provided approved in writing by a physician licensed 15 16 to practice medicine in all its branches.

17 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and dispensed in 18 State housing assigned to employees of the Department of 19 Corrections. No person shall furnish or allow to be furnished 20 any alcoholic liquors to any prisoner confined in any jail, 21 reformatory, prison or house of correction except upon a 22 physician's prescription for medicinal purposes.

23 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the Willard Ice Building in Springfield, at the State Library 24 25 in Springfield, and at Illinois State Museum facilities by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or 26 executive, provided that such agency first obtains written 27 permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the 28 29 controlling government authority, or by (2) a not-for-profit 30 organization, provided that such organization:

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a. Obtains written consent from the controlling government authority;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a
 manner that does not impair normal operations of State

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offices located in the building;

c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building;

4 d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and 5 in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and 6 7 indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing 8 9 of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit 10 11 organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or 12 dispensing of alcoholic liquors at authorized functions. 13

The controlling government authority for the Willard 14 Ice in Springfield shall be the Director of 15 Building the 16 Department of Revenue. The controlling government authority for Illinois State Museum facilities shall be the Director of 17 the Illinois State Museum. The controlling government 18 19 authority for the State Library in Springfield shall be the Secretary of State. 20

21 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail 22 or dispensed at any facility, property or building under the 23 jurisdiction of the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln 24 25 Presidential Library and Museum where the delivery, sale or dispensing is by (1) an agency of the State, whether 26 legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency 27 first obtains written permission to sell 28 or dispense 29 alcoholic liquors from a controlling government authority, or 30 by (2) a not-for-profit organization provided that such organization: 31

a. Obtains written consent from the controlling 32 33 government authority;

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b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a

1 manner that does not impair normal workings of State 2 offices or operations located at the facility, property 3 or building;

c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in
connection with an official activity of the
not-for-profit organization in the facility, property or
building;

8 d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram 9 shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and 10 in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and 11 indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, 12 damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing 13 of alcoholic liquors.

14 The controlling government authority for the Historic 15 Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation 16 Agency shall be the Director of the Historic Sites and 17 Preservation, and the controlling government authority for 18 the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum shall be 19 the Director of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and 20 Museum.

21 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at 22 the James R. Thompson Center in Chicago and 222 South College 23 Street in Springfield, Illinois by (1) a commercial tenant or subtenant conducting business on the premises under a lease 24 25 made pursuant to Section 405-315 of the Department of Central Management Services Law (20 ILCS 405/405-315), provided that 26 such tenant or subtenant who sells or dispenses alcoholic 27 liquors shall procure and maintain dram shop liability 28 29 insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier 30 agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out 31 of the sale or dispensing of alcoholic liquors, or by (2) an 32 33 agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written 34

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permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the Director of Central Management Services, or by (3) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization: a. Obtains written consent from the Department of

a. Obtains written consent from the Department of
Central Management Services;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a
manner that does not impair normal operations of State
offices located in the building;

9 c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in 10 connection with an official activity in the building;

d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram
shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and
in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and
indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss,
damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing
of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Director of Central Management Services.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered at any facility owned by the Illinois Sports Facilities Authority provided that dram shop liability insurance has been made available in a form, with such coverage and in such amounts as the Authority reasonably determines is necessary.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the Rockford State Office Building by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the Department of Central Management Services, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:

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a. Obtains written consent from the Department of

Central Management Services;

2 b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State 3 4 offices located in the building;

c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in 5 connection with an official activity in the building; 6

7 Provides, or its catering service provides, dram d. 8 shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and 9 in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, 10 11 damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors. 12

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit 13 organization or agency of the State from employing the 14 services of a catering establishment for the selling or 15 16 dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Department of Central Management Services. 17

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in a building 18 19 that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county in the City of Bloomington, and used by the McLean 20 21 County Historical Society if the sale or delivery is approved by an ordinance adopted by the county board, and 22 the municipality in which the building is located may not 23 prohibit that sale or delivery, notwithstanding any other 24 25 provision of this Section. The regulation of the sale and delivery of alcoholic liquor in a building that is owned by 26 McLean County, situated on land owned by the county, and used 27 by the McLean County Historical Society as provided in this 28 paragraph is an exclusive power and function of the State and 29 is a denial and limitation under Article VII, Section 6, 30 subsection (h) of the Illinois Constitution of the power of a 31 32 home rule municipality to regulate that sale and delivery.

33 Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in any building situated on land held in trust for any school 34

district organized under Article 34 of the School Code, if
 the building is not used for school purposes and if the sale
 or delivery is approved by the board of education.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in buildings owned by the Community Building Complex Committee of Boone County, Illinois if the person or facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance with coverage and in amounts that the Committee reasonably determines are necessary.

10 Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in the 11 building located at 1200 Centerville Avenue in Belleville, 12 Illinois and occupied by either the Belleville Area Special 13 Education District or the Belleville Area Special Services 14 Cooperative.
