- 1 AN ACT in relation to public aid.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 9A-11.10 as follows:
- 6 (305 ILCS 5/9A-11.10 new)
- 7 Sec. 9A-11.10. Child care during non-traditional working
- 8 hours.
- 9 <u>(a) In this Section, "non-traditional working hours"</u>
- 10 means any time other than the period from 7:00 a.m. through
- 11 <u>6:00 p.m.</u>
- 12 (b) The Department of Human Services shall select 2
- 13 providers of child care services to offer such services
- 14 <u>during non-traditional working hours. Each provider must be</u>
- 15 <u>located in an area of the State with a high concentration of</u>
- 16 persons whose employment requires them to work during
- 17 <u>non-traditional working hours. One provider must be located</u>
- 18 <u>in the Chicago metropolitan area, and the other must be</u>
- 19 <u>located a county other than Cook, Lake, McHenry, Kane,</u>
- 20 <u>DuPage, or Will. The Department shall pay a cash bonus to</u>
- 21 <u>each provider in addition to the rates otherwise paid for</u>
- 22 <u>child care services under Section 9A-11. The Department may</u>
- 23 <u>also offer other incentives to each provider to secure the</u>
- 24 provision of child care services during non-traditional
- working hours.
- 26 <u>(c) The Department of Human Services shall also</u>
