- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963 is
- 5 amended by changing Section 112-3 as follows:
- 6 (725 ILCS 5/112-3) (from Ch. 38, par. 112-3)
- 7 Sec. 112-3. Duration of Grand Jury.
- 8 (a) In counties with a population in excess of 1,000,000
- 9 a Grand Jury shall be convened, impaneled and sworn, and
- 10 shall commence the performance of its duties for an
- indeterminate period, on the first Monday of each month. In
- 12 such counties a Grand Jury shall serve until discharged by
- 13 the court, except that no Grand Jury shall serve in excess of
- 14 18 months and not more than 6 Grand Juries shall sit at the
- 15 same time.
- In counties with a population of in-excess-of-225,000-but
- 17 less than 1,000,000 a Grand Jury may be convened, empaneled,
- 18 and sworn and may sit at such times and for such periods as
- 19 the circuit court may order on its own motion or that of the
- 20 State's Attorney. No Grand Jury shall serve in excess of 18
- 21 months and not more than 2 Grand Juries shall sit at the same
- 22 time.
- 23 (b) (Blank). In-all-other-counties-the-Grand-Jury-shall
- be-called-and-sit-at-such-times-and-for-such-periods--as--the

- 29 (c) At any time for cause shown the court may excuse a
- 30 grand juror either temporarily or permanently and, if
- 31 permanently, may impanel another person in place of the grand
