Specific duties of the athletic 2 trainer include but are not limited to: A. supervision of the selection, fitting, and 3 4 maintenance of protective equipment; 5 B. provision of assistance to the coaching staff in the development and implementation of conditioning 6 7 programs; C. counseling of athletes on nutrition and hygiene; 8 9 supervision of athletic training facility and inspection of playing facilities; 10 E. selection and maintenance of athletic training 11 12 equipment and supplies; F. instruction and supervision of student trainer 13 staff; 14 15 coordination with a team physician to provide: 16 (i) pre-competition physical exam and health history updates, 17 18 (ii) game coverage or phone access to a 19 physician or paramedic, (iii) follow-up injury care, 20 (iv) <u>athletic</u> <u>rehabilitation</u> <u>and</u> 21 22 reconditioning programs, and 23 (v) assistance on all matters pertaining to the health and well-being of athletes: -24 25 H. provision of on-site injury care and evaluation 26 as well as appropriate transportation, follow-up and treatment rehabilitation as necessary for all 2.7 injuries sustained by athletes in the program; 28 29 I. with a physician, determination of when an 30 athlete may safely return to full participation 31 post-injury; and J. maintenance of complete and accurate records of 32

all athletic injuries and treatments rendered.

To carry out these functions the athletic trainer is

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- 1 authorized to utilize modalities <u>including</u>, <u>but not limited</u>
- 2 to, such-as heat, light, sound, cold, electricity, exercise,
- 3 <u>therapeutic massage, mobilization,</u> or mechanical <u>and</u>
- 4 <u>protective</u> devices related to <u>treatment and rehabilitation</u>
- 5 care-and-reconditioning.
- 6 (5) "Referral" means the guidance and or direction to
- 7 the-athletic--trainer given by the physician, who shall
- 8 maintain supervision of the athlete.
- 9 <u>(6) "Athlete" means an individual who participates in</u>
- 10 sports, athletic competitions or practices, athletic fitness
- 11 <u>training</u>, <u>athletic conditioning</u>, <u>or athletic recreational</u>
- 12 <u>activities</u>, as determined by a physician.
