AN ACT concerning the display of historical documents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Historical Writings Display Act.

б Section 5. Historical writing defined. "Historical writing" means a writing, proclamation, speech text, or some 7 8 other document that is of historical or cultural significance. "Historic writing" includes, without 9 limitation, the following: 10 (1) the Magna Carta; 11 (2) the Mayflower Compact; 12 13 (3) the national motto; (4) the Declaration of Independence; 14 (6) the United States Constitution; 15 16 (7) the Illinois Constitution; (8) the national anthem; 17 (9) the Pledge of Allegiance; 18 19 (10) the writings, speeches, documents, or 20 proclamations of the Founders or the Presidents of the United States; 21 22 (11) Court opinions; (12) Acts and resolutions of the United States 23 Congress or of the Illinois General Assembly; and 24 (13) the Ten Commandments. 25

Section 10. Display by local governments. A unit of local government may allow an official of that unit of local government to read or post for public display in a public building or at a public event all or part of an historical writing. Nothing in this Section is intended to limit the items that a unit of local government may place on public
 display.

3 Section 15. Display by schools. A school board may allow 4 a teacher or administrator of a school district to read or 5 post for public display in a public school building, in a 6 public school classroom, or at a public school event all or 7 part of an historical writing. Nothing in this Section is 8 intended to limit the items that a school district may place 9 on public display.

Section 97. Severability. The provisions of this Act are severable under Section 1.31 of the Statute on Statutes.
