- 1 AN ACT concerning education.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
- 5 2-3.250 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/2-3.25o)
- 7 <u>Sec. 2-3.25o. Non-public elementary and secondary</u>
- 8 schools; voluntary registration and recognition.
- 9 <u>(a) Voluntary program. In order to ensure that all</u>
- 10 <u>Illinois students and teachers have the opportunity to enroll</u>
- 11 and work in State-approved educational institutions and
- 12 programs, the State Board of Education shall provide for the
- 13 <u>voluntary registration and recognition of non-public</u>
- 14 <u>elementary and secondary schools.</u>
- 15 (b) Registration. All non-public elementary and
- 16 <u>secondary schools in the State of Illinois may voluntarily</u>
- 17 register with the State Board of Education on an annual
- 18 <u>basis</u>. Registration shall be completed in conformance with
- 19 procedures prescribed by the State Board of Education.
- 20 <u>Information required for registration shall include</u>
- 21 <u>assurances of compliance (i) with federal and State laws</u>
- 22 <u>regarding health examination and immunization, attendance,</u>
- 23 <u>length of term, and nondiscrimination and (ii) with</u>
- 24 <u>applicable fire and health safety requirements.</u>
- 25 (c) Recognition. All non-public elementary and
- 26 <u>secondary schools in the State of Illinois may voluntarily</u>
- 27 <u>seek the status of "Non-public School Recognition" from the</u>
- 28 State Board of Education. This status may be obtained by
- 29 <u>compliance with administrative guidelines and review</u>
- 30 procedures as prescribed by the State Board of Education. The
- 31 <u>quidelines</u> and <u>procedures</u> must recognize that some of the

- 1 aims and the financial bases of non-public schools are
- 2 <u>different from public schools and will not be identical to</u>
- 3 those for public schools, nor will they be more burdensome.
- 4 The guidelines and procedures must also recognize the
- 5 <u>diversity of non-public schools and shall not impinge upon</u>
- 6 the noneducational relationships between those schools and
- 7 <u>their clientele.</u>
- 8 (d) Public purposes. The provisions of this Section are
- 9 <u>in the public interest, for the public benefit, and serve</u>
- 10 <u>secular public purposes.</u>
- 11 (e) Definition. For purposes of this Section, a
- 12 <u>non-public school means any non-profit, non-home-based, and</u>
- 13 <u>non-public elementary or secondary school that is in</u>
- 14 compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and
- 15 <u>attendance at which satisfies the requirements of Section</u>
- 16 <u>26-1 of this Code.</u>
- 17 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 18 becoming law.
