- 16 (2) Crohn's disease affects both adults and
- children, affects men and women equally, and about 20% of
- 18 <u>people with Crohn's disease have a blood relative with</u>
- 19 <u>some form of inflammatory bowel disease.</u>
- 20 (3) Crohn's disease is difficult to diagnose
- 21 <u>because its symptoms are similar to other intestinal</u>
- disorders.
- 23 <u>(4) There is no cure for Crohn's disease, so</u>
- 24 <u>treatment focuses on controlling inflammation, correcting</u>
- 25 <u>nutritional deficiencies, and alleviating painful and</u>
- debilitating symptoms.
