1 AN ACT

AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
HIV/AIDS Prevention Program for Department of Corrections
Offenders, Significant Others, and Family Act.

Section 5. Definition. In this Act, "HIV/AIDS" means the
human immunodeficiency virus or any other identified
causative agent of acquired immunodeficiency syndrome.

Section 10. HIV/AIDS Prevention Program for Department of 10 11 Corrections Offenders, Significant Others, and Family. The 12 Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Health shall jointly develop and implement an HIV/AIDS prevention 13 14 education program targeted to offenders incarcerated in 15 Department of Corrections facilities, significant others, and family of adult and juvenile prison inmates. Through this 16 17 program, the Illinois Department of Corrections shall: (1) provide, in all public waiting rooms of detention facilities 18 19 and prisons, printed information on the transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually 20 21 transmitted diseases and referral information to community-based-providers of HIV/AIDS prevention, HIV/AIDS 22 treatment, and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing services 23 throughout Illinois; (2) display in all public waiting rooms 24 of detention facilities and prisons an HIV/AIDS informational 25 26 video, produced by a national organization with expertise in HIV/AIDS prevention; (3) provide written information on the 27 transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and 28 other sexually transmitted diseases to all inmates upon 29 entrance to a detention center or prison and offer voluntary 30

HIV/AIDS testing to all inmates; and (4) provide written information on the transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually transmitted diseases to all inmates just prior to their release from custody and referral to appropriate community based organizations that provide HIV/AIDS services and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing.

7 Section 15. Report to the General Assembly. One year 8 after implementation of this Act, the Illinois Department of 9 Corrections shall report to the General Assembly on the 10 effectiveness of this program in increasing voluntary 11 HIV/AIDS testing.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect uponbecoming law.
