SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations for Fiscal Year 2005 from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Public Health for AIDS/HIV education, services, counseling, testing, referral, and partner notification. Provides that FY05 funding shall be at least \$6,000,000 more than FY04 funding. Effective on July 1, 2004.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The amount of \$18,508,600, or so much of
5 that amount as may be necessary, reduced by any other amounts
6 that may be appropriated for these purposes for the fiscal
7 year beginning July 1, 2004, but not reduced by more than
8 \$12,508,600, is appropriated for the fiscal year beginning
9 July 1, 2004 from the General Revenue Fund to the Department
10 of Public Health for expenses of programs related to
11 Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS) and Human
12 Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV): for Expenses of AIDS/HIV
13 Education, Services, Counseling, Testing, Referral and
14 Partner Notification (CTRPN), and Patient and Worker
15 Notification pursuant to Public Act 87-763.

16 It is the intention of this Section that appropriations
17 for these purposes be at a level for the fiscal year
18 beginning July 1, 2004 that is at least \$6,000,000 more than
19 the appropriations for these purposes for the fiscal year
20 beginning July 1, 2003, which were in the amount of
21 \$12,508,600. Thus, if all other appropriations for these
22 purposes in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004 (i) are
23 equal to or less than \$12,508,600, then the aggregate
24 appropriations for these purposes, including those other
25 appropriations and the appropriations under this Section,
26 will be \$18,508,600 and (ii) are more than \$12,508,600, then
27 the aggregate appropriations for these purposes, including
28 those other appropriations and the appropriations under this
29 Section, will be \$6,000,000 more than those other
30 appropriations.

31 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on July

1 1, 2004.
