SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

10 ILCS 5/4-8.03	from Ch.	46,	par.	4-8.03
10 ILCS 5/5-7.03	from Ch.	46,	par.	5-7.03
10 ILCS 5/6-35.03	from Ch.	46,	par.	6-35.03

Amends the Election Code. Provides that a registered voter who changes his or her residence at the same street address does not have to transfer voter registration.

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AN ACT concerning elections.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing 5 Sections 4-8.03, 5-7.03, and 6-35.03 as follows:

6 (10 ILCS 5/4-8.03) (from Ch. 46, par. 4-8.03)

Sec. 4-8.03. The State Board of Elections shall design a 7 registration record card which, except as otherwise provided in 8 9 this Section, shall be used in triplicate by all election 10 authorities in the State, except those election authorities adopting a computer-based voter registration file authorized 11 12 under Section 4-33. The Board shall prescribe the form and specifications, including but not limited to the weight of 13 14 paper, color and print of such cards. Such cards shall contain 15 boxes or spaces for the information required under Sections 4-8 and 4-21 of this Code; provided, that such cards shall also 16 17 contain a box or space for the applicant's social security number, which shall be required to the extent allowed by law 18 19 but in no case shall the applicant provide fewer than the last 4 digits of the social security number, and a box for the 20 applicant's telephone number, if available. 21

22 Except for those election authorities adopting а 23 computer-based voter registration file authorized under Section 4-33, 24 the original and duplicate cards shall 25 respectively constitute the master file and precinct binder registration records of the voter. A copy shall be given to the 26 applicant upon completion of his or her registration or 27 28 completed transfer of registration.

Whenever a voter moves to another precinct within the same election jurisdiction or to another election jurisdiction in the State, such voter may transfer his or her registration by presenting his or her copy to the election authority or a HB4761 - 2 - LRB093 19370 JAM 45108 b

deputy registrar. If such voter is not in possession of or has lost his or her copy, he or she may effect a transfer of registration by executing an Affidavit of Cancellation of Previous Registration. <u>A voter who moves to a different</u> <u>residence at the same street address as the residence at which</u> <u>he or she is registered need not transfer that registration.</u>

In the case of a transfer of registration to a new election 7 jurisdiction, the election authority shall transmit the 8 9 voter's copy or such affidavit to the election authority of the voter's former election jurisdiction, which shall immediately 10 11 cause the transmission of the voter's previous registration 12 card to the voter's new election authority. No transfer of 13 registration to a new election jurisdiction shall be complete until voter's old election authority receives 14 the 15 notification.

Deputy registrars shall return all copies of registration 16 17 record cards or Affidavits of Cancellation of Previous Registration to the election authority within 7 working days 18 after the receipt thereof, except that such copies or 19 Affidavits of Cancellation of Previous Registration received 20 by the deputy registrars between the 35th and 28th day 21 22 preceding an election shall be returned by the deputy 23 registrars to the election authority within 48 hours after receipt. The deputy registrars shall return the copies or 24 Affidavits of Cancellation of Previous Registration received 25 26 by them on the 28th day preceding an election to the election 27 authority within 24 hours after receipt thereof.

30 Sec. 5-7.03. The State Board of Elections shall design a 31 registration record card which, except as otherwise provided in 32 this Section, shall be used in triplicate by all election 33 authorities in the State, except those election authorities 34 adopting a computer-based voter registration file authorized 35 under Section 5-43. 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1 specifications, including but not limited to the weight of 2 paper, color and print of such cards. Such cards shall contain 3 boxes or spaces for the information required under Sections 5-7 4 and 5-28.1 of this Code; provided, that such cards shall also 5 contain a box or space for the applicant's social security 6 number, which shall be required to the extent allowed by law but in no case shall the applicant provide fewer than the last 7 8 4 digits of the social security number, and a box for the 9 applicant's telephone number, if available.

10 Except for those election authorities adopting а 11 computer-based voter registration file authorized under 12 Section 5-43, the original and duplicate cards shall 13 respectively constitute the master file and precinct binder registration records of the voter. A copy shall be given to the 14 15 applicant upon completion of his or her registration or 16 completed transfer of registration.

17 Whenever a voter moves to another precinct within the same election jurisdiction or to another election jurisdiction in 18 19 the State, such voter may transfer his or her registration by 20 presenting his or her copy to the election authority or a deputy registrar. If such voter is not in possession of or has 21 22 lost his or her copy, he or she may effect a transfer of 23 registration by executing an Affidavit of Cancellation of Previous Registration. A voter who moves to a different 24 residence at the same street address as the residence at which 25 26 he or she is registered need not transfer that registration. In 27 the case of a transfer of registration to a new election 28 jurisdiction, the election authority shall transmit the voter's copy or such affidavit to the election authority of the 29 30 voter's former election jurisdiction, which shall immediately cause the transmission of the voter's previous registration 31 32 card to the voter's new election authority. No transfer of registration to a new election jurisdiction shall be complete 33 voter's old election authority 34 until the receives 35 notification.

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Deputy registrars shall return all copies of registration

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1 record cards or Affidavits of Cancellation of Previous 2 Registration to the election authority within 7 working days 3 after the receipt thereof, except that such copies or 4 Affidavits of Cancellation of Previous Registration received 5 by the deputy registrars between the 35th and 28th day returned by the 6 preceding an election shall be deputy registrars to the election authority within 48 hours after 7 8 receipt. The deputy registrars shall return the copies or Affidavits of Cancellation of Previous Registration received 9 10 by them on the 28th day preceding an election to the election 11 authority within 24 hours after receipt thereof.

14 Sec. 6-35.03. The State Board of Elections shall design a 15 registration record card which, except as otherwise provided in 16 this Section, shall be used in triplicate by all election authorities in the State, except those election authorities 17 18 adopting a computer-based voter registration file authorized 19 under Section 6-79. The Board shall prescribe the form and 20 specifications, including but not limited to the weight of paper, color and print of such cards. Such cards shall contain 21 22 boxes or spaces for the information required under Sections 23 6-31.1 and 6-35 of this Code; provided, that such cards shall 24 also contain a box or space for the applicant's social security 25 number, which shall be required to the extent allowed by law 26 but in no case shall the applicant provide fewer than the last 27 4 digits of the social security number, and a box for the 28 applicant's telephone number, if available.

29 Except for those election authorities adopting а computer-based voter registration 30 file authorized under 31 Section 6-79, the original and duplicate cards shall 32 respectively constitute the master file and precinct binder 33 registration records of the voter. A copy shall be given to the applicant upon completion of his or her registration or 34 35 completed transfer of registration.

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1 Whenever a voter moves to another precinct within the same 2 election jurisdiction or to another election jurisdiction in 3 the State, such voter may transfer his or her registration by 4 presenting his or her copy to the election authority or a 5 deputy registrar. If such voter is not in possession of or has 6 lost his or her copy, he or she may effect a transfer of 7 registration by executing an Affidavit of Cancellation of Previous Registration. <u>A voter who moves to a different</u> 8 9 residence at the same street address as the residence at which he or she is registered need not transfer that registration. 10

11 In the case of a transfer of registration to a new election 12 jurisdiction, the election authority shall transmit the voter's copy or such affidavit to the election authority of the 13 voter's former election jurisdiction, which shall immediately 14 15 cause the transmission of the voter's previous registration 16 card to the voter's new election authority. No transfer of 17 registration to a new election jurisdiction shall be complete until the voter's old election authority 18 receives 19 notification.

Deputy registrars shall return all copies of registration 20 record cards or Affidavits of Cancellation of Previous 21 22 Registration to the election authority within 7 working days 23 after the receipt thereof. Such copies or Affidavits of 24 Cancellation of Previous Registration received by the deputy registrars between the 35th and 28th day preceding an election 25 26 shall be returned by the deputy registrars within 48 hours 27 after receipt thereof. Such copies or Affidavits of Cancellation of Previous Registration received by the deputy 28 29 registrars on the 28th day preceding an election shall be 30 returned by the deputy registrars to the election authority within 24 hours after receipt thereof. 31
