Sec. 20. Powers and duties of the Department.

9 (a) The Department <u>must</u> shall exercise the powers and 10 duties prescribed by the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois 11 for the administration of licensure Acts and <u>must</u> shall 12 exercise other powers and duties necessary for effectuating the 13 purposes of this Act.

14 (b) The Department may adopt rules to administer and 15 enforce this Act, including but not limited to fees for original licensure and renewal and restoration of licenses, and 16 17 may prescribe forms to be issued to implement this Act. At a 18 minimum, the rules adopted by the Department must shall include 19 standards and criteria for licensure and for professional conduct and discipline. The Department must shall consult with 20 21 the Board in adopting rules. Notice of proposed rulemaking must 22 shall be transmitted to the Board, and the Department must 23 shall review the Board's response and any recommendations made in the response. The Department <u>must</u> shall notify the Board in 24 25 writing with proper explanation of deviations from the Board's 26 recommendations and response.

(c) The Department may at any time seek the advice and expert knowledge of the Board on any matter relating to the administration of this Act.

30 (d) The Department <u>must</u> shall issue a quarterly report to
31 the Board of the status of all complaints related to the
32 profession and filed with the Department.
