1 AN ACT concerning immigrants and refugees.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Attorney General Act is amended by changing Section 6.6 as follows:
- 6 (15 ILCS 205/6.6)
- 7 Sec. 6.6. Immigrant Assistance Program.
- (a) Purpose and policy. The immigrant population of the 8 State of Illinois constitutes a significant portion of the 9 population of the State of Illinois. These immigrants often 10 require assistance in order to obtain the government services 11 to which they are entitled under the law. It is imperative that 12 State government is aware of the needs of the State's immigrant 13 14 community and sensitive to the barriers that may prevent them 15 from seeking and obtaining services. The Office of the Attorney General should be equipped to assist immigrants by increasing 16 17 accessibility to the Office and providing outreach services to the community, which will serve to educate immigrants as to 18 19 their rights and responsibilities as residents of the State.
  - (b) Immigrant Assistance Program. Within the Office of the Attorney General, there shall be established an Immigrant which shall be charged with Assistance Program, responsibility of assessing the needs of the State's immigrant community with regard to access to government and other services. In addition, the Immigrant Assistance Program shall be empowered to provide education and outreach services to the the State, immigrant community of subject to availability. These services may include, but are not limited to, consumer issues, civil rights issues, employee rights, and other issues of particular interest to the immigrant communities in the State.
