SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 25/18

from Ch. 111, par. 2318

Amends the Illinois Dental Practice Act. Changes the circumstances under which a dental hygienist may be employed or engaged. Provides the procedures and acts that a dental hygienist may perform under specified circumstances.

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AN ACT concerning dental hygienists.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3 Section 5. The Illinois Dental Practice Act is amended by 4 5 changing Section 18 as follows: (225 ILCS 25/18) (from Ch. 111, par. 2318) 6 7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2006) Sec. 18. Acts constituting the practice of dental hygiene; -8 limitations. 9 (1) A dental hygienist may be employed or engaged only: 10 (a) Under the supervision of a dentist: (1) in the 11 office of a dentist.+ 12 (2) By a federal, State, county or municipal agency or 13 14 institution; 15 (3) By a public or private school; or 16 (4) By a public clinic operating under the direction of 17 a hospital or federal, State, county, municipal or other public agency or institution. 18 19 When employed or engaged pursuant to this paragraph (a) a dental hygienist may perform the following procedures and acts: 20 21 (i) the operative procedure of dental hygiene, consisting of oral prophylactic procedures; 22 (ii) the exposure and processing of X-Ray films of 23 24 the teeth and surrounding structures; (iii) the application to the surfaces of the teeth 25 26 or gums of chemical compounds designed to be desensitizing agents or effective agents 27 the in 28 prevention of dental caries or periodontal disease; (iv) all services which may be performed by a 29 30 dental assistant as specified by rule pursuant to Section 17; 31 32 (v) administration and monitoring of nitrous oxide

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1upon successful completion of a training program2approved by the Department;

(vi) administration of local anesthetics upon successful completion of a training program approved by the Department; and

(vii) such other procedures and acts as shall be prescribed by rule or regulation of the Department.

(b) Under the general supervision of a dentist (i) in 8 9 the office of a dentist, (ii) in a long-term care facility licensed by the State of Illinois, (iii) in or a mental 10 11 health or developmental disability facility operated by 12 the Department of Human Services, (iv) in a public or private school, (v) in a hospital, (vi) in a prison, (vii) 13 in a community health center or clinic, (viii) in a mobile 14 unit, or (ix) in a home health setting if the patient is 15 16 unable to travel to a dental office because of illness or 17 infirmity. The dentist shall personally examine diagnose the patient and determine which services 18 are necessary to be performed, which shall be contained in a 19 20 order to the hygienist. Such order must implemented within 120 days of its issuance, and An updated 21 medical history and oral inspection must be performed by 22 23 hygienist immediately prior to the beginning the procedures to ensure that the patient's health has 24 not 25 changed in any manner to warrant a reexamination by the dentist. The authorizing dentist shall be responsible for 26 27 providing the dental examination in a reasonable and suitable time frame to ensure the patient's overall oral 28 29 health.

30 <u>Before a dental hygienist may be employed or engaged under</u> 31 <u>the general supervision of a dentist, he or she must have been</u> 32 <u>actively engaged in the practice of dental hygiene under the</u> 33 <u>direct supervision of a dentist for a period of at least 12</u> 34 <u>months. A dental hygienist who provides services under the</u> 35 <u>general supervision of a dentist must show proof of</u> 36 <u>professional liability insurance.</u>

1 (2) (c) Without the supervision of a dentist, a dental 2 hygienist may perform dental health education functions and may record case histories and oral conditions observed or, in a 3 public health setting, as defined jointly by the Department of 4 5 Public Health and the Illinois State Board of Dentistry, provide fluoride treatments, cleanings, and sealants for 6 Medicaid eligible children. 7

Before a dental hygienist may be employed or engaged 8 9 without the supervision of a dentist, he or she must have been actively engaged in the practice of dental hygiene under the 10 11 direct supervision of a dentist for a period of at least 24 months. A dental hygienist who provides services without the 12 supervision of a dentist must show proof of professional 13 liability insurance. 14

15 (3) The number of dental hygienists practicing in a dental 16 office shall not exceed, at any one time, 4 times the number of 17 dentists practicing in the office at the time.

(4) When employed or engaged pursuant to paragraph (a) or 18 (b) of subsection (1) of this Section, a dental hygienist may 19 20 perform the following procedures and acts:

(a) the operative procedure of dental hygiene, 21 22 consisting of oral prophylactic procedures;

23 (b) the exposure and processing of X-Ray films of the teeth and surrounding structures;

(c) the application to the surfaces of the teeth or 25 gums of chemical compounds designed to be desensitizing 26 27 agents or effective agents in the prevention of dental 28 caries or periodontal disease;

(d) all services which may be performed by a dental 29 30 assistant as specified by rule pursuant to Section 17; and

31 (e) such other procedures and acts as shall be prescribed by rule or regulation of the Department. 32

(5) A dental hygienist may only perform the following 33 procedures and acts upon successful completion of a training 34 35 program approved by the Department under the supervision of a
