SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

415 ILCS 5/3.458 new 415 ILCS 5/56.1 415 ILCS 5/56.7 new

from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 1056.1

Amends the Environmental Protection Act. Provides that no permit shall be required for the operation of a sharps collection station if the operator follows certain procedures concerning the acceptance, storage, treatment, disposal, and transportation of the medical waste. Defines "sharps collection station". Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY

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1 AN ACT concerning infectious medical waste.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4	Section 5. The Environmental Protection Act is amended by
5	changing Section 56.1 and by adding Sections 3.458 and 56.7 as
6	follows:

- 7 (415 ILCS 5/3.458 new)
- 8 Sec. 3.458. Sharps collection station.
- (a) "Sharps collection station" means a designated area at 9 an applicable facility where (i) hypodermic, intravenous, or 10 other medical needles, (ii) hypodermic or intravenous 11 syringes, or (iii) medical household waste containing medical 12 sharps, including, but not limited to, hypodermic, 13 intravenous, or other medical needles, and hypodermic or 14 15 intravenous syringes, are collected for transport, storage, treatment, transfer, or disposal. 16
- 17 <u>(b) For purposes of this Section, "applicable facility"</u>
 18 means any of the following:
- 19 (1) A hospital.
- 20 (2) A physician's office.
- 21 (3) A pharmacy employing a registered pharmacist.
- 23 official who is authorized under Section 1 of the
 24 Hypodermic Syringes and Needles Act (720 ILCS 635/) to
 25 possess hypodermic, intravenous, or other medical needles,
 26 or hypodermic or intravenous syringes, by reason of his or
 27 her official duties.
 - (5) The base of operation of any physician, registered professional nurse, nurse acting under the direction of a physician, or other person authorized under Section 1 of the Hypodermic Syringes and Needles Act to possess hypodermic, intravenous, or other medical needles, or

- hypodermic or intravenous syringes, that provides 1 2 healthcare services at sites other than his or her base of

- Sec. 56.1. Acts prohibited. 5
- (A) No person shall: 6
- 7 (a) Cause or allow the disposal of any potentially 8 infectious medical waste. Sharps may be disposed in any 9 landfill permitted by the Agency under Section 21 of this Act to accept municipal waste for disposal, if both:
- 11 (1) the infectious potential has been eliminated from the sharps by treatment; and 12
- (2) the sharps are packaged in accordance with Board 13 regulations. 14
 - (b) Cause or allow the delivery of any potentially infectious medical waste for transport, storage, treatment, or transfer except in accordance with Board regulations.
- 18 (c) Beginning July 1, 1992, cause or allow the delivery of 19 any potentially infectious medical waste to a person or facility for storage, treatment, or transfer that does not have 20 a permit issued by the agency to receive potentially infectious 21 22 medical waste, unless no permit is required under subsection 23 (g)(1).
 - (d) Beginning July 1, 1992, cause or allow the delivery or transfer of any potentially infectious medical waste for transport unless:
 - (1) the transporter has a permit issued by the Agency to transport potentially infectious medical waste, or the transporter is exempt from the permit requirement set forth in subsection (f)(l).
 - (2) a potentially infectious medical waste manifest is completed for the waste if a manifest is required under subsection (h).
- (e) Cause or allow the acceptance of any potentially 34 35 infectious medical waste for purposes of transport, storage,

- (f) Beginning July 1, 1992, conduct any potentially infectious medical waste transportation operation:
 - (1) Without a permit issued by the Agency to transport potentially infectious medical waste. No permit is required under this provision (f) (1) for:
 - (A) a person transporting potentially infectious medical waste generated solely by that person's activities;
 - (B) noncommercial transportation of less than 50 pounds of potentially infectious medical waste at any one time; or
 - (C) the U.S. Postal Service.
 - (2) In violation of any condition of any permit issued by the Agency under this Act.
 - (3) In violation of any regulation adopted by the Board.
- 19 (4) In violation of any order adopted by the Board 20 under this Act.
 - (g) Beginning July 1, 1992, conduct any potentially infectious medical waste treatment, storage, or transfer operation:
 - (1) without a permit issued by the Agency that specifically authorizes the treatment, storage, or transfer of potentially infectious medical waste. No permit is required under this subsection (g) or subsection (d)(1) of Section 21 for any:
 - (A) Person conducting a potentially infectious medical waste treatment, storage, or transfer operation for potentially infectious medical waste generated by the person's own activities that are treated, stored, or transferred within the site where the potentially infectious medical waste is generated.
 - (B) Hospital that treats, stores, or transfers only potentially infectious medical waste generated by

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- 2 (C) Sharps collection station that is operated in accordance with Section 56.7.
 - (2) in violation of any condition of any permit issued by the Agency under this Act.
 - (3) in violation of any regulation adopted by the Board.
 - (4) In violation of any order adopted by the Board under this Act.
 - (h) Transport potentially infectious medical waste unless the transporter carries a completed potentially infectious medical waste manifest. No manifest is required for the transportation of:
 - (1) potentially infectious medical waste being transported by generators who generated the waste by their own activities, when the potentially infectious medical waste is transported within or between sites or facilities owned, controlled, or operated by that person;
 - (2) less than 50 pounds of potentially infectious medical waste at any one time for a noncommercial transportation activity; or
 - (3) potentially infectious medical waste by the U.S. Postal Service.
 - (i) Offer for transportation, transport, deliver, receive or accept potentially infectious medical waste for which a manifest is required, unless the manifest indicates that the fee required under Section 56.4 of this Act has been paid.
 - (j) Beginning January 1, 1994, conduct a potentially infectious medical waste treatment operation at an incinerator in existence on the effective date of this Title in violation of emission standards established for these incinerators under Section 129 of the Clean Air Act (42 USC 7429), as amended.
 - (B) In making its orders and determinations relative to penalties, if any, to be imposed for violating subdivision (A)(a) of this Section, the Board, in addition to the factors in Sections 33(c) and 42(h) of this Act, or the Court shall

- 7 Sec. 56.7. No permit shall be required under subsection
- 8 (d)(1) of Section 21 or subsection (g) of Section 56.1 of this
- 9 Act for a sharps collection station if the station is operated
- in accordance with all of the following:
- 11 (1) The only waste accepted at the sharps collection
- 12 <u>station is (i) hypodermic, intravenous, or other medical</u>
- needles, (ii) hypodermic or intravenous syringes; and
- 14 <u>(iii) medical household waste containing used or unused</u>
- sharps, including but not limited to, hypodermic,
- intravenous, or other medical needles, and hypodermic or
- intravenous syringes.
- 18 (2) The waste is stored and transferred in the same
- manner as required for potentially infectious medical
- waste under this Act and under Board regulations.
- 21 (3) The waste is not treated at the sharps collection
- 22 station unless it is treated in the same manner as required
- 23 <u>for potentially infectious medical waste under this Act and</u>
- 24 under Board regulations.
- 25 <u>(4) The waste is not disposed of at the sharps</u>
- 26 <u>collection station.</u>
- 27 <u>(5) The waste is transported in the same manner as</u>
- 28 <u>required for potentially infectious medical waste under</u>
- this Act and under Board regulations.
