The sum of \$45,000, or so much of this 7 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Police 8 Memorial Committee Fund to the Office of the Secretary of 9 State for grants to the Police Memorial Committee for 10 maintaining a memorial statue, holding an annual memorial 11 commemoration, and giving scholarships to children to police 12 officers killed in the line of duty.

Section 145. The sum of \$160,000, or so much of this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Mammogram Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for grants to the Susan G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer research, education, screening, and treatment.

The following amounts, or so much of these amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated 21 to the Office of the Secretary of State for such purposes in 22 Section 3-646 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5), for 23 grants to the Regional Organ Bank of Illinois and to Mid-24 America Transplant Services for the purpose of promotion of 25 26 organ and tissue donation awareness. 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Section 185. The amount of \$225,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Alternate Fuels Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for the cost of administering the Alternate Fuels Act.

6 Section 190. The amount of \$14,691,500, or so much of 7 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the 8 Secretary of State Special Services Fund to the Office of the 9 Secretary of State for office automation and technology.
