2 WHEREAS, A recent study by the Parents Television Council indicated a jump in profanity in virtually every network and 3 4 every time slot, finding that foul language increased during 5 the 8 to 9 p.m. "family hour" by 94.8% between 1998 and 2002 and during the 9 to 10 p.m. hour by 109% in the same period; and 6 Council 7 WHEREAS, The Parents Television 8 television industry needs to get serious about reducing the 9 flood of vulgarity coming into homes via television; and 10 WHEREAS, According to Syracuse University Professor Robert Thompson: 11 Once prime-time television decides to absorb something, it 12 13 becomes a stamp of normalcy. It's no longer controversial. It's no longer a big deal. It makes it a casual, accepted 14 15 sort of thing; and 16 WHEREAS, According to P.M. Forni, cofounder of the Civility 17 Project at Johns Hopkins University: 18 Very often, rudeness and cursing are the beginning of an 19 escalation toward violence. Words, our words, are like our 20 hands.
