AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 52
AMENDMENT NO. ____. Amend Senate Bill 52 by replacing
everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Child Passenger Protection Act is 5 amended by changing Sections 2, 4, 4a, 4b, and 5 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 25/2) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 1102)

Legislative Finding - Purpose. The General 7 Sec. 2. Assembly finds that a substantial number of passengers under 8 9 the age of $\underline{8}$ 6 years riding in motor vehicles, which are most 10 frequently operated by a parent, annually die or sustain serious physical injury as a direct result of not being 11 placed in <u>an appropriate</u> a child passenger restraint system. 12 Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for 13 14 children of every age from 4 to 14 years old. The General Assembly further finds that the safety of the motoring public 15 is seriously threatened as indicated by the significant 16 number of traffic accidents annually caused, directly or 17 indirectly, by driver distraction or other impairment of 18 driving ability induced by the movement or actions of 19 unrestrained passengers under the age of $\underline{8}$ 6 years. 20

21 It is the purpose of this Act to further protect the 22 health, safety and welfare of motor vehicle passengers under 1 the age of <u>8</u> 6 years and the motoring public through the 2 proper utilization of approved child restraint systems. 3 (Source: P.A. 83-8.)

(625 ILCS 25/4) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 1104) 4 5 Sec. 4. When any person is transporting a child in this State under the age of $\underline{8}$ 4 years in a non-commercial motor 6 7 vehicle of the first division, a motor vehicle of the second division with a gross vehicle weight rating of 9,000 pounds 8 or less, or a recreational vehicle on the roadways, streets 9 10 or highways of this State, such person shall be responsible for providing for the protection of such child by properly 11 12 securing him or her in <u>an appropriate</u> a child restraint system. The parent or legal guardian of a child under the age 13 14 of <u>8</u> 4 years shall provide a child restraint system to any person who transports his or her child. Any person who 15 transports the child of another shall not be in violation of 16 17 this Section unless a child restraint system was provided by the parent or legal guardian but not used to transport the 18 child. 19

For purposes of this Section and Section <u>4b</u> 4a, "child restraint system" means any device which meets the standards of the United States Department of Transportation designed to restrain, seat or position children, which also includes a <u>booster seat</u>.

A child weighing more than 40 pounds may be transported in the back seat of a motor vehicle while wearing only a lap belt if the back seat of the motor vehicle is not equipped with a combination lap and shoulder belt.

31 Sec. 4a. Every person, when transporting a child <u>8</u> 4 32 years of age or older but under the age of 16, as provided in Section 4 of this Act, shall be responsible for properly
securing that child in either-a--child--restraint--system--or
seat belts.

6 Sec. 4b. Children <u>8</u> 6 years of age or older but under 7 the age of 18; seat belts. Every person under the age of 18 8 years, when transporting a child <u>8</u> 6 years of age or older 9 but under the age of 18 years, as provided in Section 4 of 10 this Act, shall be responsible for securing that child in a 11 properly adjusted and fastened seat safety belt <u>or an</u> 12 <u>appropriate child restraint system</u>.

Sec. 5. In no event shall a person's failure to secure a child under <u>8</u> 6 years of age in an approved child restraint system or--properly--secure--such-child7-if-age-4-or-57-in-a seat-belt constitute contributory negligence or be admissible as evidence in the trial of any civil action.
