- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Mental Health and Developmental
- 5 Disabilities Administrative Act is amended by adding Section
- 6 12.2 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 1705/12.2 new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 12.2. Mental Health Commitment Training.</u>
- 9 <u>(a) The Department shall develop and present annually at</u>
- 10 <u>least one training event for judges, state's attorneys,</u>
- 11 public defenders, private attorneys, law enforcement
- 12 personnel, hospital and community agency personnel, persons
- 13 <u>with mental illness, physicians, psychologists, social</u>
- 14 workers, emergency room personnel, and other health care
- 15 personnel regarding mental illness, the standards for civil
- 16 <u>commitment</u> and <u>involuntary</u> <u>treatment</u>, <u>completing</u>
- 17 <u>documentation</u>, <u>and changes in the Mental Health and</u>
- 18 <u>Developmental Disabilities Code and Mental Health and</u>
- 19 <u>Developmental Disabilities Confidentiality Act.</u>
- 20 (b) The Department may provide multiple training events,
- 21 regional training events, and training events by professional
- 22 <u>discipline</u>. The materials developed for the training events
- 23 <u>shall be made available on the Department's website. The</u>
- 24 Department shall develop this training in cooperation with
- 25 <u>the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts, bar</u>
- 26 <u>associations</u>, the Illinois Law Enforcement Standards and
- 27 <u>Training Board, appropriate statewide organizations</u>
- 28 <u>representing health care providers, organizations</u>
- 29 <u>representing or advocating for persons with mental illness,</u>
- 30 and any appropriate statewide organization of licensed

- (c) The Department shall annually report on the number 1
- of persons attending the training events.
