- 1 AN ACT in relation to criminal law.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 1. The Sale of Tobacco to Minors Act is amended
- 5 by changing Section 1 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 675/1) (from Ch. 23, par. 2357)
- 7 Sec. 1. No minor under 18 years of age shall buy any
- 8 cigar, cigarette, smokeless tobacco or tobacco in any of its
- 9 forms. No person shall sell, buy for, distribute samples of
- or furnish any cigar, cigarette, smokeless tobacco or tobacco
- in any of its forms, to any minor under 18 years of age. No
- 12 minor under 18 years of age may be employed or permitted to
- 13 <u>sell any cigar, cigarette, smokeless tobacco, or tobacco in</u>
- 14 any of its forms at a retail establishment authorized to sell
- 15 <u>tobacco products. No minor under 18 years of age may sell</u>
- 16 any cigar, cigarette, smokeless tobacco, or tobacco in any of
- 17 <u>its forms at a retail establishment authorized to sell</u>
- 18 <u>tobacco products</u>. This Section does not apply to a sales
- 19 <u>clerk in a family-owned business which can prove that the</u>
- 20 <u>sales clerk is in fact a son or daughter of the owner.</u>
- 21 For the purpose of this Section, "smokeless tobacco"
- 22 means any tobacco products that are suitable for dipping or
- chewing.
- 24 Tobacco products listed above may be sold through a
- vending machine only in the following locations:
- 26 (1) Factories, businesses, offices, private clubs,
- and other places not open to the general public.
- 28 (2) Places to which minors under 18 years of age
- are not permitted access.
- 30 (3) Places where alcoholic beverages are sold and
- 31 consumed on the premises.

- (4) Places where the vending machine is under the direct supervision of the owner of the establishment or an employee over 18 years of age. The sale of tobacco products from a vending machine under direct supervision of the owner or an employee of the establishment is considered a sale of tobacco products by that person. As used in this subdivision, "direct supervision" means that the owner or employee has an unimpeded line of sight to the vending machine.
 - (5) Places where the vending machine can only be operated by the owner or an employee over age 18 either directly or through a remote control device if the device is inaccessible to all customers.
