(b) Under the general supervision of a dentist (i) in the office of a dentist, (ii) in a long-term care facility licensed by the State of Illinois, (iii) in or a mental health or developmental disability facility operated by the Department of Human Services, (iv) in a public or private school, (v) in a hospital, (vi) in a prison, (vii) in a community health center or clinic, (viii) in a mobile unit, or (ix) in a home health setting if the patient is unable to travel to a dental office because of illness or infirmity. The--dentist-shall personally-examine-and-diagnose-the-patient-and-determine which-services-are-necessary-to-be-performed,-which-shall be-contained-in-a-written-order-to-the--hygienist----Such order-must-be-implemented-within-90-days-of-its-issuance, and An updated medical history and oral inspection must be performed by the hygienist immediately prior to beginning the procedures to--ensure--that--the--patient's health--has--not--changed--in--any--manner--to--warrant-a reexamination-by-the--dentist. Before a dental hygienist may be employed or engaged under the general supervision of a dentist, he or she must have been actively engaged in the practice of dental

5	<u>insurance.</u>
6	(2)(e) Without the supervision of a dentist, a dental
