- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Department of Public Health Powers and
- 5 Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
- 6 amended by adding Section 2310-371 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 2310/2310-371 new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 2310-371. Obesity Study and Prevention Fund.</u>
- 9 (a) Findings and declarations. The General Assembly
- 10 <u>finds and declares the following:</u>
- 11 (1) that obesity is a serious medical problem
- 12 <u>affecting up to one-third of all Americans;</u>
- 13 (2) that obesity is known to cause or exacerbate a
- 14 <u>number of serious disorders including hypertension,</u>
- 15 <u>dyslipidemia</u>, <u>cardiovascular</u> <u>disease</u>, <u>diabetes</u>,
- respiratory dysfunction, gout, and osteoarthritis;
- 17 (3) that nearly 80% of patients with diabetes
- 18 <u>mellitus are obese;</u>
- 19 <u>(4) that nearly 70% of diagnosed cases of</u>
- 20 <u>cardiovascular disease are related to obesity; and</u>
- 21 (5) that obesity ranks second only to smoking as a
- 22 <u>preventable cause of death, with some 300,000 deaths</u>
- 23 <u>annually attributable to obesity.</u>
- (b) <u>Definition of "obesity"</u>. <u>In this Section, "obesity"</u>
- 25 means the term as it is defined by the National Institutes of
- Health including, but not limited to, the condition in which
- 27 <u>a person's body mass index is at least 30 kilograms per meter</u>
- 28 <u>squared, or the condition in which a person's body mass index</u>
- 29 <u>is at least 27 kilograms per meter squared and the person</u>
- 30 <u>suffers from one or more of the following conditions or</u>
- 31 <u>diseases: (i) type II diabetes; (ii) impaired glucose</u>

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- tolerance; (iii) hyperinsulinemia; (iv) dyslipidemia; (v) 1
- hypertension; (vi) cardiovascular disease; (vii) 2
- cerebrovascular disease; (viii) osteoarthritis of the hips or 3
- 4 knees; (ix) sleep apnea; (x) gastric reflux disease; or (xi)
- 5 gallbladder disease.
- (c) Data collection and report to the General Assembly. 6
- 7 (1) Subject to appropriation, the Department, or
- 8 its designee, shall sample and collect data on individual
- 9 cases where obesity is being actively treated and analyze
- that data in order to evaluate the impact of treating 10
- 11 obesity. The data collection and analysis shall include
- 12 the following: (i) the effectiveness of existing methods
- for treating or preventing obesity; (ii) the 13
- effectiveness of alternate methods for treating or 14
- preventing obesity; (iii) the fiscal impact of treating 15

- (d) Obesity Study and Prevention Fund. The Obesity Study 24
- and Prevention Fund is established in the State treasury. 25
- Moneys in the Fund shall be earmarked for use by the 26
- Department to conduct or support research regarding obesity 27
- and shall be expended in accordance with the provisions of 28
- this Section. Any Fund balance remaining at the end of a 29
- fiscal year shall be carried forward into the next fiscal 30
- 31 year. Income accruing on investments and deposits of the Fund
- shall be deposited into the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be 32
- invested by the Treasurer and administered by the Director of 33
