- 1 AN ACT regarding schools.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
- 5 Section 27A-5 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/27A-5)
- 7 Sec. 27A-5. Charter school; legal entity; requirements.
- 8 (a) A charter school shall be a public, nonsectarian,
- 9 nonreligious, non-home based, and non-profit school. A
- 10 charter school shall be organized and operated as a nonprofit
- 11 corporation or other discrete, legal, nonprofit entity
- 12 authorized under the laws of this the State of-Hlinois.
- 13 (b) A charter school may be established under this
- 14 Article by creating a new school or by converting an existing
- 15 public school or attendance center to charter school status.
- 16 (c) A charter school shall be administered and governed
- 17 by its board of directors or other governing body in the
- 18 manner provided in its charter. The governing body of a
- 19 charter school shall be subject to the Freedom of Information
- 20 Act and the Open Meetings Act.
- 21 (d) A charter school shall comply with all applicable
- 22 health and safety requirements applicable to public schools
- 23 under the laws of the State of Illinois.
- 24 (e) Except as otherwise provided in the School Code, a
- 25 charter school shall not charge tuition; provided that a
- 26 charter school may charge reasonable fees for textbooks,
- instructional materials, and student activities.
- 28 (f) A charter school shall be responsible for the
- 29 management and operation of its fiscal affairs including, but
- 30 not limited to, the preparation of its budget. An audit of
- 31 each charter school's finances shall be conducted annually by

- 1 an outside, independent contractor retained by the charter
- 2 school.
- 3 (g) A charter school shall comply with all provisions of
- 4 this Article and its charter. A charter school is exempt
- 5 from all other State laws and regulations in the School Code
- 6 governing public schools and local school board policies,
- 7 except the following:
- 8 (1) Sections 10-21.9 and 34-18.5 of the School Code
- 9 regarding criminal background investigations of
- 10 applicants for employment;
- 11 (2) Sections 24-24 and 34-84A of the School Code
- 12 regarding discipline of students;
- 13 (3) The Local Governmental and Governmental
- 14 Employees Tort Immunity Act;
- 15 (4) Section 108.75 of the General Not For Profit
- 16 Corporation Act of 1986 regarding indemnification of
- officers, directors, employees, and agents;
- 18 (5) The Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act;
- 19 (6) The Illinois School Student Records Act; and
- 20 (7) Section 10-17a of the School Code regarding
- 21 school report cards.
- (h) A charter school may negotiate and contract with a
- 23 school district, the governing body of a State college or
- 24 university or public community college, or any other public
- or for-profit or nonprofit private entity for: (i) the use of
- 26 a school building and grounds or any other real property or
- 27 facilities that the charter school desires to use or convert
- 28 for use as a charter school site, (ii) the operation and
- 29 maintenance thereof, and (iii) the provision of any service,
- 30 activity, or undertaking that the charter school is required
- 31 to perform in order to carry out the terms of its charter.
- 32 Except as provided in subsection (i) of this Section, a
- 33 school district may charge a charter school reasonable rent
- 34 for the use of the district's buildings, grounds, and

- 1 facilities. Any services for which a charter school
- 2 contracts with a school district shall be provided by the
- 3 district at cost. Any services for which a charter school
- 4 contracts with a local school board or with the governing
- 5 body of a State college or university or public community
- 6 college shall be provided by the public entity at cost.
- 7 (i) In no event shall a charter school that is
- 8 established by converting an existing school or attendance
- 9 center to charter school status be required to pay rent for
- 10 space that is deemed available, as negotiated and provided in
- 11 the charter agreement, in school district facilities.
- 12 However, all other costs for the operation and maintenance of
- 13 school district facilities that are used by the charter
- 14 school shall be subject to negotiation between the charter
- school and the local school board and shall be set forth in
- 16 the charter.
- 17 (j) A charter school may limit student enrollment by age
- 18 or grade level.
