Amends the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois and the Department of Human Services Act. Transfers certain programs from the Department of Human Services to the Department of Community Disability Health Care and certain other programs to the Department of State Facilities for Developmental Disabilities and Mental Health. Effective July 1, 2005.
