SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

40 ILCS 5/16-127	from Ch.	108 1/2,	par. 16-127
40 ILCS 5/16-128	from Ch.	108 1/2,	par. 16-128

Amends the Downstate Teacher Article of the Illinois Pension Code. Allows purchase up to 5 (rather than 2) years of service credit for time spent on active duty in the armed forces before becoming a participant, and reduces the required contribution for that credit. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by changing
Sections 16-127 and 16-128 as follows:

6 (40 ILCS 5/16-127) (from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 16-127)

Sec. 16-127. Computation of creditable service.

8 (a) Each member shall receive regular credit for all 9 service as a teacher from the date membership begins, for which 10 satisfactory evidence is supplied and all contributions have 11 been paid.

12 (b) The following periods of service shall earn optional 13 credit and each member shall receive credit for all such 14 service for which satisfactory evidence is supplied and all 15 contributions have been paid as of the date specified:

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(1) Prior service as a teacher.

Service in a capacity essentially similar or 17 (2) 18 equivalent to that of a teacher, in the public common 19 schools in school districts in this State not included within the provisions of this System, or of any other 20 State, territory, dependency or possession of the United 21 States, or in schools operated by or under the auspices of 22 23 the United States, or under the auspices of any agency or department of any other State, and service during any 24 25 period of professional speech correction or special 26 education experience for a public agency within this State 27 or any other State, territory, dependency or possession of the United States, and service prior to February 1, 1951 as 28 29 a recreation worker for the Illinois Department of Public 30 Safety, for a period not exceeding the lesser of 2/5 of the total creditable service of the member or 10 years. The 31 maximum service of 10 years which is allowable under this 32

1 paragraph shall be reduced by the service credit which is 2 validated by other retirement systems under paragraph (i) of Section 15-113 and paragraph 1 of Section 17-133. Credit 3 used granted under this paragraph may not be 4 in 5 determination of a retirement annuity or disability benefits unless the member has at least 5 years 6 of creditable service earned subsequent to this employment 7 with one or more of the following systems: Teachers' 8 9 Retirement System of the State of Illinois, State 10 Universities Retirement System, and the Public School 11 Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund of Chicago. Whenever such service credit exceeds the maximum allowed for all 12 purposes of this Article, the first service rendered in 13 point of time shall be considered. The changes to this 14 subdivision (b)(2) made by Public Act 86-272 shall apply 15 16 not only to persons who on or after its effective date 17 (August 23, 1989) are in service as a teacher under the System, but also to persons whose status as such a teacher 18 terminated prior to such effective date, whether or not 19 20 such person is an annuitant on that date.

immediately following 21 (3) Any periods teaching service, under this System or under Article 17, (or 22 immediately following service prior to February 1, 1951 as 23 a recreation worker for the Illinois Department of Public 24 25 Safety) spent in active service with the military forces of the United States; periods spent in educational programs 26 27 that prepare for return to teaching sponsored by the 28 federal government following such active military service; if a teacher returns to teaching service within one 29 calendar year after discharge or after the completion of 30 31 the educational program, a further period, not exceeding 32 one calendar year, between time spent in military service such educational programs and the return 33 or in to employment as a teacher under this System; and a period of 34 up to <u>5 years</u> 2 years of active military service not 35 immediately following employment as a teacher. 36

1 The changes to this Section and Section 16-128 relating to military service made by P.A. 87-794 shall apply not 2 3 only to persons who on or after its effective date are in service as a teacher under the System, but also to persons 4 5 whose status as a teacher terminated prior to that date, whether or not the person is an annuitant on that date. In 6 the case of an annuitant who applies for credit allowable 7 under this Section for a period of military service that 8 did not immediately follow employment, and who has made the 9 10 required contributions for such credit, the annuity shall 11 be recalculated to include the additional service credit, with the increase taking effect on the date the System 12 received written notification of the annuitant's intent to 13 purchase the credit, if payment of all the required 14 contributions is made within 60 days of such notice, or 15 16 else on the first annuity payment date following the date 17 of payment of the required contributions. In calculating the automatic annual increase for an annuity that has been 18 recalculated under this Section, the increase attributable 19 20 to the additional service allowable under P.A. 87-794 shall included in the calculation of automatic annual 21 be increases accruing after the effective date of the 22 23 recalculation.

Credit for military service shall be determined as 24 25 follows: if entry occurs during the months of July, August, 26 or September and the member was a teacher at the end of the 27 immediately preceding school term, credit shall be granted 28 from July 1 of the year in which he or she entered service; if entry occurs during the school term and the teacher was 29 30 in teaching service at the beginning of the school term, 31 credit shall be granted from July 1 of such year. In all 32 other cases where credit for military service is allowed, credit shall be granted from the date of entry into the 33 34 service.

35 The total period of military service for which credit 36 is granted shall not exceed 5 years for any member unless - 4 - LRB093 19550 LRD 45290 b

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the service: (A) is validated before July 1, 1964, and (B) 1 2 does not extend beyond July 1, 1963. Credit for military service shall be granted under this Section only if not 3 more than 5 years of the military service for which credit 4 5 is granted under this Section is used by the member to 6 qualify for a military retirement allotment from any branch of the armed forces of the United States. The changes to 7 this subdivision (b)(3) made by Public Act 86-272 shall 8 apply not only to persons who on or after its effective 9 10 date (August 23, 1989) are in service as a teacher under 11 the System, but also to persons whose status as such a 12 teacher terminated prior to such effective date, whether or not such person is an annuitant on that date. 13

(4) Any periods served as a member of the General Assembly.

16 (5) (i) Any periods for which a teacher, as defined in 17 Section 16-106, is granted a leave of absence, provided he or she returns to teaching service creditable under this 18 System or the State Universities Retirement 19 System 20 following the leave; (ii) periods during which a teacher is involuntarily laid off from teaching, provided he or she 21 returns to teaching following the lay-off; (iii) periods 22 prior to July 1, 1983 during which a teacher ceased covered 23 employment due to pregnancy, provided that the teacher 24 returned to teaching service creditable under this System 25 or the State Universities Retirement System following the 26 27 pregnancy and submits evidence satisfactory to the Board 28 documenting that the employment ceased due to pregnancy; 29 and (iv) periods prior to July 1, 1983 during which a 30 teacher ceased covered employment for the purpose of adopting an infant under 3 years of age or caring for a 31 32 newly adopted infant under 3 years of age, provided that the teacher returned to teaching service creditable under 33 this System or the State Universities Retirement System 34 following the adoption and submits evidence satisfactory 35 36 to the Board documenting that the employment ceased for the

purpose of adopting an infant under 3 years of age or caring for a newly adopted infant under 3 years of age. However, total credit under this paragraph (5) may not exceed 3 years.

5 Any qualified member or annuitant may apply for credit 6 under item (iii) or (iv) of this paragraph (5) without regard to whether service was terminated before the 7 effective date of this amendatory Act of 1997. In the case 8 9 of an annuitant who establishes credit under item (iii) or 10 (iv), the annuity shall be recalculated to include the 11 additional service credit. The increase in annuity shall 12 take effect on the date the System receives written notification of the annuitant's intent to purchase the 13 credit, if the required evidence is submitted and the 14 required contribution paid within 15 60 days of that 16 notification, otherwise on the first annuity payment date 17 following the System's receipt of the required evidence and contribution. The increase in an annuity recalculated 18 under this provision shall be included in the calculation 19 20 of automatic annual increases in the annuity accruing after the effective date of the recalculation. 21

Optional credit may be purchased under this subsection 22 23 (b) (5) for periods during which a teacher has been granted a leave of absence pursuant to Section 24-13 of the School 24 Code. A teacher whose service under this Article terminated 25 prior to the effective date of P.A. 86-1488 shall be 26 27 eligible to purchase such optional credit. If a teacher who 28 purchases this optional credit is already receiving a retirement annuity under this Article, the annuity shall be 29 30 recalculated as if the annuitant had applied for the leave of absence credit at the time of retirement. The difference 31 32 between the entitled annuity and the actual annuity shall be credited to the purchase of the optional credit. The 33 remainder of the purchase cost of the optional credit shall 34 be paid on or before April 1, 1992. 35

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The change in this paragraph made by Public Act 86-273

shall be applicable to teachers who retire after June 1,
 1989, as well as to teachers who are in service on that
 date.

(6) Any days of unused and uncompensated accumulated 4 5 sick leave earned by a teacher. The service credit granted under this paragraph shall be the ratio of the number of 6 unused and uncompensated accumulated sick leave days to 170 7 days, subject to a maximum of 2 years of service credit. 8 9 Prior to the member's retirement, each former employer 10 shall certify to the System the number of unused and 11 uncompensated accumulated sick leave days credited to the 12 member at the time of termination of service. The period of unused sick leave shall not be considered in determining 13 the effective date of retirement. A member is not required 14 to make contributions in order to obtain service credit for 15 16 unused sick leave.

17 Credit for sick leave shall, at retirement, be granted 18 by the System for any retiring regional or assistant 19 regional superintendent of schools at the rate of 6 days 20 per year of creditable service or portion thereof 21 established while serving as such superintendent or 22 assistant superintendent.

(7) Periods prior to February 1, 1987 served as an
employee of the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy
for which credit has not been terminated under Section
15-113.9 of this Code.

27 (8) Service as a substitute teacher for work performed
28 prior to July 1, 1990.

29 (9) Service as a part-time teacher for work performed
 30 prior to July 1, 1990.

(10) Up to 2 years of employment with Southern Illinois
University - Carbondale from September 1, 1959 to August
31, 1961, or with Governors State University from September
1, 1972 to August 31, 1974, for which the teacher has no
credit under Article 15. To receive credit under this item
(10), a teacher must apply in writing to the Board and pay

1 2 the required contributions before May 1, 1993 and have at least 12 years of service credit under this Article.

(b-1) A member may establish optional credit for up to 2 3 years of service as a teacher or administrator employed by a 4 5 private school recognized by the Illinois State Board of 6 Education, provided that the teacher (i) was certified under the law governing the certification of teachers at the time the 7 8 service was rendered, (ii) applies in writing on or after June 9 1, 2002 and on or before June 1, 2005, (iii) supplies 10 satisfactory evidence of the employment, (iv) completes at 11 least 10 years of contributing service as a teacher as defined 12 in Section 16-106, and (v) pays the contribution required in 13 subsection (d-5) of Section 16-128. The member may apply for credit under this subsection and pay the required contribution 14 15 before completing the 10 years of contributing service required 16 under item (iv), but the credit may not be used until the item 17 (iv) contributing service requirement has been met.

(c) The service credits specified in this Section shall be 18 19 granted only if: (1) such service credits are not used for 20 credit in any other statutory tax-supported public employee retirement system other than the federal Social Security 21 22 program; and (2) the member makes the required contributions as 23 specified in Section 16-128. Except as provided in subsection (b-1) of this Section, the service credit shall be effective as 24 of the date the required contributions are completed. 25

Any service credits granted under this Section shall terminate upon cessation of membership for any cause.

28 Credit may not be granted under this Section covering any 29 period for which an age retirement or disability retirement 30 allowance has been paid.

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Sec. 16-128. Creditable service - required contributions.

34 (a) In order to receive the creditable service specified35 under subsection (b) of Section 16-127, a member is required to

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1 make the following contributions: (i) an amount equal to the 2 contributions which would have been required had such service 3 been rendered as a member under this System; (ii) for military service not immediately following employment and for service 4 5 established under subdivision (b)(10) of Section 16-127, an 6 amount determined by the Board to be equal to the employer's normal cost of the benefits accrued for such service; and (iii) 7 8 interest from the date the contributions would have been due 9 (or, in the case of a person establishing credit for military service under subdivision (b)(3) of Section 16-127, the date of 10 first membership in the System, if that date is later) to the 11 12 date of payment, at the following rate of interest, compounded 13 annually: for periods prior to July 1, 1965, regular interest; from July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1977, 4% per year; on and after 14 15 July 1, 1977, regular interest.

(b) In order to receive creditable service under paragraph
(2) of subsection (b) of Section 16-127 for those who were not
members on June 30, 1963, the minimum required contribution
shall be \$420 per year of service together with interest at 4%
per year compounded annually from July 1, preceding the date of
membership until June 30, 1977 and at regular interest
compounded annually thereafter to the date of payment.

23 (c) In determining the contribution required in order to 24 receive creditable service under paragraph (3) of subsection (b) of Section 16-127, the salary rate for the remainder of the 25 26 school term in which a member enters military service shall be 27 assumed to be equal to the member's salary rate at the time of 28 entering military service. However, for military service not 29 immediately following employment, the salary rate on the last 30 date as a participating teacher prior to such military service, 31 or on the first date as a participating teacher after such 32 military service, whichever is greater, shall be assumed to be equal to the member's salary rate at the time of entering 33 military service. For each school term thereafter, the member's 34 35 salary rate shall be assumed to be 5% higher than the salary 36 rate in the previous school term.

1 (d) In determining the contribution required in order to 2 receive creditable service under paragraph (5) of subsection 3 (b) of Section 16-127, a member's salary rate during the period 4 for which credit is being established shall be assumed to be 5 equal to the member's last salary rate immediately preceding 6 that period.

7 (d-5) For each year of service credit to be established 8 under subsection (b-1) of Section 16-127, a member is required to contribute to the System (i) 16.5% of the annual salary rate 9 during the first year of full-time employment as a teacher 10 11 under this Article following the private school service, plus 12 (ii) interest thereon from the date of first full-time employment as a teacher under this Article following the 13 private school service to the date of payment, compounded 14 15 annually, at the rate of 8.5% per year for periods before the 16 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General 17 Assembly, and for subsequent periods at a rate equal to the System's actuarially assumed rate of return on investments. 18

(e) The contributions required under this Section may be
made from the date the statement for such creditable service is
issued until retirement date. All such required contributions
must be made before any retirement annuity is granted.
