1 amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future
2 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
3 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Manteno for the
4 purchase of a senior citizen van.

5 Section 1120. The amount of \$270,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 6, Section 1120 of Public Act 93-0587, as
9 amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future
10 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
11 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Skokie for the
12 purchase of an emergency vehicle and a hazardous national
13 rescue vehicle.

14 Section 1125. The amount of \$197,337, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
17 made in Article 6, Section 1125 of Public Act 93-0587, as
18 amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future
19 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
20 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Skokie for all costs
21 associated with the purchase of equipment, software,
22 vehicles, computers, defibrillators, and program expenses.

23 Section 1130. The amount of \$175,000, or so much thereof
24 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
25 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
26 made in Article 6, Section 1130 of Public Act 93-0587, as
27 amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future
28 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
29 the purpose of a grant to the Leadership Council of
30 Southwestern Illinois for activities associated with the
31 retention of Scott Air Force Base.

2 Section 1405. The sum of \$172,500, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
5 made in Article 6, Section 1405 of Public Act 93-0587, is
6 reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the
7 Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to
8 units of local government and not-for-profit organizations
9 for infrastructure improvements including but not limited to
10 planning, construction, reconstruction, renovation,
11 equipment, supplies and all costs associated with economic
12 development programs, educational training and programs,
13 community services, public health programs, and public safety
14 programs.

15 Section 1410. The sum of \$182,151, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made in Article 6, Section 1410 of Public Act 93-0587, is
19 reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the
20 Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to
21 units of local government, educational facilities and not-
22 for-profit organizations for municipal, recreational,
23 educational, and public safety infrastructure improvements
24 and other expenses, including but not limited to training,
25 planning, construction, reconstruction, renovation,
26 utilities, and equipment, and all costs associated with
27 economic development programs, educational training and
28 programs, community services, public health programs, and
29 public safety programs.

30 Section 1415. The sum of \$21,146, or so much thereof as
31 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
32 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore

1 made in Article 6, Section 1415 of Public Act 93-0587, is
2 reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the
3 Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to
4 units of local government, educational facilities and not-
5 for-profit organizations for education and training,
6 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects,
7 including but not limited to planning, construction,
8 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
9 costs associated with economic development programs,
10 community service programs, public health programs, public
11 safety programs, and other programs and activities.

12 Section 1420. The amount of \$9,729,332, or so much
13 thereof as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the
14 close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation
15 heretofore made in Article 6, Section 1420 of Public Act 93-
16 0587, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to
17 the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants
18 to units of government, educational facilities and not-for-
19 profit organizations for education and training,
20 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects,
21 including but not limited to planning, construction,
22 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
23 costs associated with economic development programs,
24 community service programs, public health programs, public
25 safety programs, and other programs and activities.
