The sum of \$350,000, or so much thereof as 7 Section 16b. may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 8 Fund to the Department of Transportation for making grants to 9 10 eligible recipients of funding under Article II of Downstate Public Transportation Act for the 11 purpose reimbursing the recipients which provide reduced fares for 12 mass transportation services for students, handicapped 13 persons and the elderly.
