8 WHEREAS, Mr. Youtzy attended Iowa State University, 9 Cornell College, and DePaul University; he spent 20 years in 10 the dairy business with the Borden Company and Oatman Dairy of 11 Aurora; he had been in the life insurance business since 1958; 12 and

13 WHEREAS, He was past president of the Aurora Association of 14 Life Underwriters, past president of the Illinois West Suburban 15 CLU Chapter, a member of Fox Valley Estate Planning Council, 16 and a member of the United Way of Aurora; he had also served 17 the Salvation Army, Association for Individual Development, 18 Aurora College, Wayside Cross Rescue Mission, Boy Scouts of 19 America, and the Girl Scouts of America; and
