- 4 Section 35. The sum of \$12,792,000, or so much thereof
- 5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Mandatory
- 6 Arbitration Fund to the Supreme Court for Mandatory
- 7 Arbitration Programs.
- 8 Section 40. The sum of \$116,800, or so much thereof as
- 9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Foreign Language
- 10 Interpreter Fund to the Supreme Court for the Foreign
- 11 Language Interpreter Program.
- 12 Section 45. The sum of \$728,000, or so much thereof as
- 13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Lawyers'
- 14 Assistance Program Fund to the Supreme Court for lawyers'
- 15 assistance programs.
- Section 50. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
- 17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Reviewing Court
- 18 Alternative Dispute Resolution Fund to the Supreme Court for
- 19 alternative dispute resolution programs within the reviewing
- 20 courts.
- 21 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
- 22 2005.
