1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4251

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend House Bill 4251 by replacing  
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Sections  
5 10-20.40 and 34-18.33 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/10-20.40 new)

7 Sec. 10-20.40. Multiple-birth children; classroom  
8 placement.

9 (a) For purposes of this Section, "higher-order multiples"  
10 means triplets, quadruplets, quintuplets, or more.

11 (b) The school board shall allow a parent or guardian of  
12 twins or higher-order multiples to request that the children be  
13 placed in the same classroom or in separate classrooms if the  
14 children are in the same grade level at the same school. The  
15 school may recommend classroom placement to the parent or  
16 guardian and provide professional educational advice to the  
17 parent or guardian to assist him or her in making the best  
18 decision for the children's education. A school must provide  
19 the placement requested by the parent or guardian, unless the  
20 school board makes a classroom placement determination  
21 following a principal's request under subsection (d) this  
22 Section.

23 (c) The parent or guardian must request classroom placement  
24 under this Section no later than 14 days after the first day of

1 each school year or 14 days after the first day of attendance  
2 of the children during a school year if the children are  
3 enrolled in the school after the school year commences.

4 (d) At the end of the initial grading period, if the  
5 school's principal, in consultation with the children's  
6 classroom teacher, determines that the classroom placement  
7 requested by the parent or guardian is disruptive to the  
8 school, then the principal may request that the school board  
9 determine the children's classroom placement.

10 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section,  
11 the classroom placement of children with disabilities, as  
12 defined in Article 14 of this Code, must be determined by each  
13 child's individualized education program.

17 (a) For purposes of this Section, "higher-order multiples"  
18 means triplets, quadruplets, quintuplets, or more.

19 (b) The board shall allow a parent or guardian of twins or  
20 higher-order multiples to request that the children be placed  
21 in the same classroom or in separate classrooms if the children  
22 are in the same grade level at the same school. The school may  
23 recommend classroom placement to the parent or guardian and  
24 provide professional educational advice to the parent or  
25 guardian to assist him or her in making the best decision for  
26 the children's education. A school must provide the placement  
27 requested by the parent or guardian, unless the board makes a  
28 classroom placement determination following a principal's  
29 request under subsection (d) this Section.

30 (c) The parent or guardian must request classroom placement  
31 under this Section no later than 14 days after the first day of  
32 each school year or 14 days after the first day of attendance  
33 of the children during a school year if the children are

1 enrolled in the school after the school year commences.

2 (d) At the end of the initial grading period, if the  
3 school's principal, in consultation with the children's  
4 classroom teacher, determines that the classroom placement  
5 requested by the parent or guardian is disruptive to the  
6 school, then the principal may request that the board determine  
7 the children's classroom placement.

8 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section,  
9 the classroom placement of children with disabilities, as
