Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 9 (a) A person commits the offense of facilitating identity
- theft when he or she, in the course of his or her employment or
- official duties, has access to the personal information of
- 12 <u>another person in the possession of the State of Illinois</u>,
- whether written, recorded, or on computer disk and knowingly,
- 14 with the intent of committing identity theft, aggravated
- 15 <u>identity theft, or any violation of the Illinois Financial</u>
- 16 <u>Crime Law, disposes of that written, recorded, or computerized</u>
- information in any receptacle, trash can, or other container
- 18 that the public could gain access to, without shredding that
- information, destroying the recording, or wiping the computer
- 20 <u>disk so that the information is either unintelligible or</u>
- 21 <u>destroyed</u>.
- 22 (b) Sentence. Facilitating identity theft is a Class A
- 23 <u>misdemeanor for a first offense and a Class 4 felony for a</u>
- 24 <u>second or subsequent offense.</u>
- 25 (c) For purposes of this Section, "personal information"
- 26 has the meaning provided in the Personal Information Protection
- 27 <u>Act.</u>

- Sec. 16G-21. Civil remedies. A person who is convicted of
- 30 <u>facilitating identity theft</u>, identity theft, or aggravated
- 31 identity theft is liable in a civil action to the person who

- 2 suffering damages may recover court costs, attorney's fees,
- 3 lost wages, and actual damages.
