Makes appropriations for capital expenditures for the following agencies: Department of Agriculture, Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Military Affairs, Department of State Police, Department of Transportation, Capital Development Board, Illinois Commerce Commission, Environmental Protection Agency, Historic Preservation Agency, Illinois Finance Authority, Medical District Commission, Illinois Emergency Management Agency, Eastern Illinois University, Northeastern Illinois University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University, University of Illinois, Illinois Community College Board, State Board of Education, and State Board of Elections.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

6 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
7 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the
8 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
9 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
10 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
11 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
12 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

13 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

14 For various projects at the State

15 Fairgrounds \$600,000

16 For various projects at the DuQuoin State

17 Fairgrounds 225,000

18 Total \$825,000

19
20 Section 10. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
22 Development Fund to the Department of Agriculture for deposit
23 into the Conservation 2000 Projects Fund.

24
25 Section 15. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
26 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Conservation
27 2000 Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture for the
28 following project at the approximate cost set forth below:

29 Conservation Practices Cost-Share Program\$2,612,500

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

5 Section 5. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
7 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for a grant to the Illinois Institute of
9 Technology for the Biomedical Research Center.

10 Section 10. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
12 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
13 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
14 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

15 Section 15. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
17 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
19 the Rare Isotope Accelerator Science Center.

20 Section 20. The sum of \$6,700,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
23 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
24 the Ricketts Regional Biocontainment Laboratory.

25 Section 25. The sum of \$1,600,000, or so much thereof as
26 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
27 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
28 Opportunity for the Applied Manufacturing Research and
29 Technology Center in Rockford.

1 Section 45. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development
3 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and
4 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the
5 Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS
6 750-9-11.

7
8 Section 50. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
10 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
11 Opportunity for a grant to Northwestern University for the
12 Nanoscale Science and Engineering Center.

13
14 Section 55. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
16 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for redevelopment of a corporate biotechnology
18 park in Skokie.

19
20 Section 60. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
23 Opportunity for a grant to the Board of Trustees of the
24 University of Illinois to plan and construct an electrical
25 and computer engineering facility at the Urbana-Champaign
26 campus and related utilities systems, including planning,
27 land acquisition, demolition, construction, remodeling,
28 landscaping, site improvements, equipment, extension or
29 modification of campus utility systems, and such expenses as
30 may be necessary to complete this facility.

31
32 Section 65. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
33 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois

1 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
2 Opportunity for a grant to the City of Marion for design and
3 construction of a multi-use regional recreational facility.
4

5 Section 70. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
7 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for a grant to the Chicago Academy for conversion
9 of a former community college facility into a magnet high
10 school.
11

12 Section 75. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
14 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
15 Opportunity for a grant to the City of Rockford for
16 development of the Center of Excellence.
17

18 Section 80. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
20 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
21 Opportunity for a grant to Parkview Foundation for a window
22 renovation project.
23

24 Section 85. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof
25 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
26 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
27 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant, but not limited to
28 Article 8, Article 9, and Article 10 of the Build Illinois
29 Act.
30

31 Section 90. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof
32 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
33 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
34 Opportunity for grants to companies to expand or construct

1 ethanol plants in Illinois.

2

3 Section 95. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois
5 Capital Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and
6 Economic Opportunity for the Manufacturing Modernization
7 Program.

13 Section 5. The amount of \$8,940,147, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made in Article 91, Section 5 of Public Act 93-0842, is
17 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
18 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
19 to the DuPage Airport Authority for planning, design,
20 construction and access infrastructure related to the hi-tech
21 business campus.

22

23 Section 10. The amount of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof
24 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
25 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
26 made in Article 91, Section 10 of Public Act 93-0842, is
27 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
28 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
29 for planning, design, construction, and all other costs
associated with a new Ford Technical Training Center.

30

31 Section 15. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made in Article 91, Section 15 of Public Act 93-0842, is
3 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
4 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
5 to Argonne National Laboratory for the "TRUE GRID I WIRE"
6 Program.

7 Section 20. The amounts of \$22,000,000 and \$551,947, or
8 so much thereof as may be necessary and remain unexpended at
9 the close of business on June 30, 2005, from reappropriations
10 heretofore made in Article 91, Section 20 of Public Act 93-
11 0842, are reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to
12 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
13 purpose of providing partial funds for planning, design,
14 engineering and testing, and construction of a low emissions
15 boiler system for Illinois high-sulfur coals.

16 No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred
17 for any expenditure made in this Section of this Article
18 until after the purpose and amounts have been approved in
19 writing by the Governor.

20 Section 25. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
22 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
23 made in Article 91, Section 25 of Public Act 93-0842, is
24 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
25 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the Coal
26 Demonstration Program.

27 Section 30. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as
28 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
29 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
30 made in Article 91, Section 30 of Public Act 93-0842, is

1 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
2 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for Coal
3 Development Programs.

4 Section 35. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
7 made in Article 91, Section 35 of Public Act 93-0842, is
8 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
9 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
10 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

11
12 Section 40. The amount of \$1,039,300, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary, and as remains unexpended at the close
14 of business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation
15 heretofore made in Article 91, Section 40 of Public Act 93-
16 0842, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
17 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
18 development of other forms of energy.

19 No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred
20 for any expenditure made in this Section of this Article
21 until after the purpose and amounts have been approved in
22 writing by the Governor.

23
24 Section 45. The sum of \$13,815,797, or so much thereof
25 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
26 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
27 made in Article 91, Section 45 of Public Act 93-0842, is
28 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
29 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
30 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
31 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

32 Section 50. The sum of \$5,420,856, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
3 made for such purpose in Article 91, Section 50 of Public Act
4 93-0842, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
5 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
6 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
7 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

8 Section 55. The sum of \$4,778,039, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made in Article 91, Section 55 of Public Act 93-0842, is
12 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
13 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
14 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
15 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

16 Section 60. The sum of \$15,533,803, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 91, Section 60 of Public Act 93-0842, is
20 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
21 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
22 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
23 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

24 Section 65. The sum of \$11,025,000, or so much thereof
25 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
26 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
27 made in Article 91, Section 65 of Public Act 93-0842, is
28 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
29 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
30 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
31 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

1 Section 70. The sum of \$10,480,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made in Article 91, Section 70 of Public Act 93-0842, is
5 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
6 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants to
7 companies to expand or construct ethanol plants in Illinois.

8 Section 75. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made in Article 91, Section 75 of Public Act 93-0842, is
12 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
13 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
14 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope
15 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. This
16 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other
17 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these
18 purposes.

19 Section 80. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
22 made in Article 91, Section 80 of Public Act 93-0842, is
23 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
24 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
25 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Nanotechnology
26 Institute for bondable infrastructure improvements. This
27 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other
28 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these
29 purposes.

30 Section 85. The sum of \$6,403,051, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore
3 made in Article 91, Section 85 of Public Act 93-0842, is
4 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
5 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
6 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Nanotechnology.

GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

12 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
14 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
15 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
16 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
17 boat access areas.

18 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
20 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes
21 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
22 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
23 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
24 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
25 areas.

26 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including
27 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
28 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
29 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the

1 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
 2 construction and development of facilities for transient,
 3 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
 4 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
 5 Grant Program.

6 Section 25. The following named sums, new
 7 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
 8 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,
 9 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

10 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

11 For multiple use facilities and
 12 programs for boating purposes
 13 provided by the Department of Natural
 14 Resources, including construction
 15 and development, all costs for supplies,
 16 materials, labor, land acquisition,
 17 services, studies and all other
 18 expenses required to comply with the
 19 intent of this appropriation1,200,000

20 Payable from State Parks Fund:

21 For multiple use facilities and programs
 22 for park and trail purposes provided by
 23 the Department of Natural Resources, including
 24 construction and development, all costs
 25 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 26 acquisition, services, studies, and
 27 all other expenses required to comply with
 28 the intent of this appropriation150,000

29 Section 30. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
 30 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish
 31 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition
 32 and development, including grants, for the implementation of

1 the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the
 2 Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically
 3 provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

4 Section 35. To the extent federal funds including
 5 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 6 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 7 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the
 8 Department of Natural Resources for construction and
 9 renovation of waste reception facilities for recreational
 10 boaters, including grants for such purposes authorized under
 11 the Clean Vessel Act.

12 Section 40. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
 13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish
 14 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for wildlife
 15 conservation and restoration plans and programs from federal
 16 funds provided for such purposes.

17 Section 45. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 18 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 19 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 20 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 21 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 22 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 23 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 24 refunds and the purposes stated:

25 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

26 For U.S. Forest Service Program500,000

27 Section 50. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
 28 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Plugging and
 29 Restoration Fund to the Department of Natural Resources,
 30 Office of Mines and Minerals for the Landowner Grant Program

1 authorized under the Oil and Gas Act, as amended by Public
2 Act 90-0260.

3 Section 55. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
5 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Set Aside
6 Fund for grants and contracts to conduct research, planning
7 and construction to eliminate hazards created by abandoned
8 mines and any other expenses necessary for emergency
9 response.

10 Section 60. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
12 Natural Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the
13 conservation of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the
14 provisions of Section 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now
15 or hereafter amended.

16 Section 65. The following named sums, new
17 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
18 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,
19 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

20 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund:

21 For the acquisition, preservation and
22 stewardship of natural areas, including habitats
23 for endangered and threatened species, high
24 quality natural communities, wetlands
25 and other areas with unique or unusual
26 natural heritage qualities6,000,000

27 Section 70. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof
28 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space
29 Lands Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of
30 Natural Resources for expenses connected with and to make

1 grants to local governments as provided in the "Open Space
2 Lands Acquisition and Development Act".

3 Section 75. The sum of \$550,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant
5 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
6 conservation of pheasants in accordance with the provisions
7 of Section 5/1.31 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter
8 amended.

9 FOR ILLINOIS HABITAT FUND PROGRAM

10 Section 80. The sum of \$1,150,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
12 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
13 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
14 accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment
15 Act", as now or hereafter amended.

16 Section 85. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
18 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
19 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and
20 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor
21 sports in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of
22 Sportsmen Series license plates.

23 Section 90. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
24 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
25 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water
26 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for
27 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress
28 dated September 3, 1954 (68 Statutes 1266, same as appears in
29 Section 701c-3, Title 33, United States Code Annotated),

1 provided such disbursement shall be in compliance with 15
2 ILCS 515/1 Illinois Compiled Statutes.

3 Section 95. The following named sums, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
5 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
6 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
7 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
8 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
9 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
10 refunds and the purposes stated:

11 Payable from Land and Water Recreation Fund:

12 For Outdoor Recreation Programs6,200,000

13 Section 100. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off Highway
15 Vehicle Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
16 for grants to units of local governments, not-for-profit
17 organizations, and other groups to operate, maintain and
18 acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as
19 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act,
20 including administration, enforcement, planning and
21 implementation of this Act.

22 Section 105. The sum of \$4,500,000 or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Conservation 2000
24 Projects Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
25 acquisition, planning and development of land and long-term
26 Easements, and cost-shared natural resource management
27 practices for ecosystem-based management of Illinois' natural
28 resources, including grants for such purposes.

29 Section 110. The following named sums, or so much
30 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either

1 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 2 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 3 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 4 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 5 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 6 refunds and the purposes stated:

7 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire
 8 Protection Assistance Fund:

9 For Rural Community Fire Protection

10 Programs325,000

11 Section 115. The sum of \$80,000, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
 13 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 14 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
 15 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
 16 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and
 17 areas for the use of snowmobiles.

18 Section 120. The sum of \$625,000, or so much thereof as
 19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
 20 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 21 the payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of
 22 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the
 23 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter
 24 amended.

25 Section 125. To the extent Federal Funds including
 26 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum
 27 of \$300,000, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
 28 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 29 Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance.

30 Section 130. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
2 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
3 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
4 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of
5 Canada or the United States which specifically provides
