SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations for capital expenditures for the following agencies: Department of Agriculture, Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Military Affairs, Department of State Police, Department of Transportation, Capital Development Board, Illinois Commerce Commission, Environmental Protection Agency, Historic Preservation Agency, Illinois Finance Authority, Medical District Commission, Illinois Emergency Management Agency, Eastern Illinois University, Northeastern Illinois University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University, University of Illinois, Illinois Community College Board, State Board of Education, and State Board of Elections.

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1 AN ACT making appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

ARTICLE 1 4 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE 5 Section 5. 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1 Section 45. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development 3 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and 4 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the 5 Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 6 750-9-11.

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8 Section 50. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as 9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois 10 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic 11 Opportunity for a grant to Northwestern University for the 12 Nanoscale Science and Engineering Center.

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Section 55. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for redevelopment of a corporate biotechnology park in Skokie.

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Section 60. The amount of \$1,039,300, or so much thereof 12 as may be necessary, and as remains unexpended at the close 13 2005, from a reappropriation business on June 30, 14 of heretofore made in Article 91, Section 40 of Public Act 93-15 0842, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the 16 17 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the development of other forms of energy. 18

The sum of \$13,815,797, or so much thereof 25 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 26 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore made in Article 91, Section 45 of Public Act 93-0842, is 27 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 28 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants 29 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or 30 31 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

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Section 50. The sum of \$5,420,856, or so much thereof as

The sum of \$4,778,039, or so much thereof as 8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 9 10 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore made in Article 91, Section 55 of Public Act 93-0842, 11 is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 12 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants 13 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or 14 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act. 15

16 Section 60. The sum of \$15,533,803, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 17 18 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore made in Article 91, Section 60 of Public Act 93-0842, 19 is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 20 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants 21 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or 22 23 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

The sum of \$11,025,000, or so much thereof 24 Section 65. as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 25 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore 26 made in Article 91, Section 65 of Public Act 93-0842, 27 is 28 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 29 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or 30 31 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

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1 Section 70. The sum of \$10,480,000, or so much thereof 2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 3 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore 4 made in Article 91, Section 70 of Public Act 93-0842, is 5 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 6 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants to 7 companies to expand or construct ethanol plants in Illinois.

Section 75. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof 8 9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore 10 made in Article 91, Section 75 of Public Act 93-0842, 11 is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 12 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant 13 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope 14 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. 15 This 16 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other appropriated amounts which can be expended 17 for these 18 purposes.

The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof Section 80. 19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 20 business on June 30, 2005, from a reappropriation heretofore 21 22 made in Article 91, Section 80 of Public Act 93-0842, is 23 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant 24 Argonne National Laboratory for the 25 to Nanotechnology Institute for bondable infrastructure improvements. 26 This appropriated amount shall be in addition to 27 any other 28 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these 29 purposes.

GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the administration and payment of grants to local governmental units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of boat access areas.

Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as 18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act 19 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes 20 21 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the 22 administration and payment of grants to local governmental 23 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease, maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access 24 25 areas.

26 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including 27 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of 28 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 29 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the

The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof 28 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space 29 Lands Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of 30 Natural Resources for expenses connected with and to make SB1365 -14- OMB094 00005 SAT 30005 b grants to local governments as provided in the "Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development Act".

3 Section 75. The sum of \$550,000, or so much thereof as 4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant 5 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the 6 conservation of pheasants in accordance with the provisions 7 of Section 5/1.31 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter 8 amended.

16 Section 85. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as 17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat 18 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the 19 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and 20 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor 21 sports in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of 22 Sportsmen Series license plates.

23 Section 90. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as 24 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of 25 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water 26 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for 27 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress 28 dated September 3, 1954 (68 Statutes 1266, same as appears in 29 Section 701c-3, Title 33, United States Code Annotated), SB1365 -15- OMB094 00005 SAT 30005 b 1 provided such disbursement shall be in compliance with 15

3 Section 95. The following named sums, or so much thereof may be necessary, respectively, herein made either 4 as 5 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government agency thereof, any municipal corporation, 6 any or or political subdivision of the State, or with any public or 7 private corporation, organization, or individual, 8 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for 9 10 refunds and the purposes stated:

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Section 100. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as 13 14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off Highway Vehicle Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources 15 16 for grants to units of local governments, not-for-profit organizations, and other groups to operate, maintain and 17 acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as 18 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act, 19 including administration, enforcement, planning 20 and implementation of this Act. 21

22 Section 105. 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1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory 2 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources 3 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North 4 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of 5 Canada or the United States which specifically provides 6 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the 7 "Wildlife Code", as amended.

Section 135. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as 8 9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory 10 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl 11 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United 12 specifically provide waterfowl States which for the 13 Mississippi Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as 14 15 amended.
