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AN ACT concerning regulation.

## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center Act is
amended by changing Section 6.5 as follows:

6 (210 ILCS 5/6.5)

Sec. 6.5. Clinical privileges; advanced practice nurses.
All ambulatory surgical treatment centers (ASTC) licensed
under this Act shall comply with the following requirements:

10 (1) No ASTC policy, rule, regulation, or practice shall be 11 inconsistent with the provision of adequate collaboration, 12 including medical direction of licensed advanced practice 13 nurses, in accordance with Section 54.5 of the Medical Practice 14 Act of 1987.

15 (2) Operative surgical procedures shall be performed only by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its 16 17 branches under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, a dentist licensed under the Illinois Dental Practice Act, or a 18 19 podiatrist licensed under the Podiatric Medical Practice Act of 20 1987, with medical staff membership and surgical clinical privileges granted by the consulting committee of the ASTC. A 21 22 licensed physician, dentist, or podiatrist may be assisted by a 23 physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, dentist, dental assistant, podiatrist, licensed advanced 24 25 licensed physician assistant, practice nurse, licensed 26 registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, surgical assistant, surgical technician, or other individuals granted 27 28 clinical privileges to assist in surgery by the consulting 29 committee of the ASTC. Payment for services rendered by an 30 assistant in surgery who is not an ambulatory surgical treatment center employee shall be paid at the appropriate 31 32 non-physician modifier rate if the payor would have made SB2238 Enrolled - 2 - LRB094 16983 DRJ 52263 b

1 payment had the same services been provided by a physician.

2 (2.5) A registered nurse licensed under the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act and qualified by training and 3 experience in operating room nursing shall be present in the 4 5 operating room and function as the circulating nurse during all invasive or operative procedures. For purposes of this 6 paragraph (2.5), "circulating nurse" means a registered nurse 7 who is responsible for coordinating all nursing care, patient 8 safety needs, and the needs of the surgical team in the 9 operating room during an invasive or operative procedure. 10

11 (3) The anesthesia service shall be under the direction of 12 a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches who has had specialized preparation or experience in the area 13 or who has completed a residency in anesthesiology. An 14 anesthesiologist, Board certified or Board eligible, is 15 16 recommended. Anesthesia services may only be administered 17 pursuant to the order of a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, licensed dentist, or licensed 18 podiatrist. 19

20 (A) The individuals who, with clinical privileges
21 granted by the medical staff and ASTC, may administer
22 anesthesia services are limited to the following:

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(i) an anesthesiologist; or

24 (ii) a physician licensed to practice medicine in25 all its branches; or

26 (iii) a dentist with authority to administer
27 anesthesia under Section 8.1 of the Illinois Dental
28 Practice Act; or

29 (iv) a licensed certified registered nurse30 anesthetist.

31 (B) For anesthesia services, an anesthesiologist shall 32 participate through discussion of and agreement with the 33 anesthesia plan and shall remain physically present and be 34 available on the premises during the delivery of anesthesia 35 services for diagnosis, consultation, and treatment of 36 emergency medical conditions. In the absence of 24-hour

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1 availability of anesthesiologists with clinical 2 privileges, an alternate policy (requiring participation, presence, and availability of a physician licensed to 3 practice medicine in all its branches) shall be developed 4 5 by the medical staff consulting committee in consultation with the anesthesia service and included in the medical 6 staff consulting committee policies. 7

(C) A certified registered nurse anesthetist is not 8 9 required to possess prescriptive authority or a written 10 collaborative agreement meeting the requirements of 11 Section 15-15 of the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing 12 Act to provide anesthesia services ordered by a licensed dentist, or podiatrist. Licensed certified 13 physician, registered nurse anesthetists are authorized to select, 14 order, and administer drugs and apply the appropriate 15 16 medical devices in the provision of anesthesia services 17 under the anesthesia plan agreed with by the anesthesiologist or, in the absence of an available 18 anesthesiologist with clinical privileges, agreed with by 19 20 the operating physician, operating dentist, or operating podiatrist in accordance with the medical staff consulting 21 committee policies of a licensed ambulatory surgical 22 treatment center. 23

25 Section 10. The Hospital Licensing Act is amended by 26 changing Section 10.7 as follows:

27 (210 ILCS 85/10.7)

28 Sec. 10.7. Clinical privileges; advanced practice nurses. 29 All hospitals licensed under this Act shall comply with the 30 following requirements:

(1) No hospital policy, rule, regulation, or practice shall
be inconsistent with the provision of adequate collaboration,
including medical direction of licensed advanced practice
nurses, in accordance with Section 54.5 of the Medical Practice

1 Act of 1987.

2 (2) Operative surgical procedures shall be performed only by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its 3 branches under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, a dentist 4 5 licensed under the Illinois Dental Practice Act, or a podiatrist licensed under the Podiatric Medical Practice Act of 6 1987, with medical staff membership and surgical clinical 7 8 privileges granted at the hospital. A licensed physician, 9 dentist, or podiatrist may be assisted by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, dentist, dental 10 11 assistant, podiatrist, licensed advanced practice nurse, 12 licensed physician assistant, licensed registered nurse, 13 licensed practical nurse, surgical assistant, surgical technician, or other individuals granted clinical privileges 14 15 to assist in surgery at the hospital. Payment for services 16 rendered by an assistant in surgery who is not a hospital 17 employee shall be paid at the appropriate non-physician modifier rate if the payor would have made payment had the same 18 19 services been provided by a physician.

20 (2.5) A registered nurse licensed under the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act and qualified by training and 21 experience in operating room nursing shall be present in the 22 23 operating room and function as the circulating nurse during all invasive or operative procedures. For purposes of this 24 paragraph (2.5), "circulating nurse" means a registered nurse 25 who is responsible for coordinating all nursing care, patient 26 27 safety needs, and the needs of the surgical team in the operating room during an invasive or operative procedure. 28

(B) For anesthesia services, an anesthesiologist shall 13 participate through discussion of and agreement with the 14 anesthesia plan and shall remain physically present and be 15 16 available on the premises during the delivery of anesthesia 17 services for diagnosis, consultation, and treatment of emergency medical conditions. In the absence of 24-hour 18 availability of anesthesiologists with medical staff 19 20 privileges, an alternate policy (requiring participation, presence, and availability of a physician licensed to 21 practice medicine in all its branches) shall be developed 22 by the medical staff and licensed hospital in consultation 23 with the anesthesia service. 24

(C) A certified registered nurse anesthetist is not 25 required to possess prescriptive authority or a written 26 27 collaborative agreement meeting the requirements of 28 Section 15-15 of the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing 29 Act to provide anesthesia services ordered by a licensed 30 physician, dentist, or podiatrist. Licensed certified 31 registered nurse anesthetists are authorized to select, 32 order, and administer drugs and apply the appropriate medical devices in the provision of anesthesia services 33 under the anesthesia plan agreed with 34 by the anesthesiologist or, in the absence of an available 35 anesthesiologist with clinical privileges, agreed with by 36

- the operating physician, operating dentist, or operating podiatrist in accordance with the hospital's alternative policy.
