SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27-6

from Ch. 122, par. 27-6

Amends the School Code. Provides that a school board may excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 from engaging in physical education courses if the pupil is getting substantial physical activity from participating in athletic training and competition in a sport under the auspices of a national governing board that is recognized by and affiliated with an international sports federation and the parent or guardian has provided documentation of such training and recognition. Effective July 1, 2006.

1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
- 5 27-6 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/27-6) (from Ch. 122, par. 27-6)
- Sec. 27-6. Courses in physical education required; special activities.
- Pupils enrolled in the public schools and State 9 universities engaged in preparing teachers shall be required to 10 engage daily during the school day, except on block scheduled 11 days for those public schools engaged in block scheduling, in 12 courses of physical education for such periods as are 13 14 compatible with the optimum growth and developmental needs of 15 individuals at the various age levels except when appropriate excuses are submitted to the school by a pupil's parent or 16 17 guardian or by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act of 1987 and except as provided in subsection (b) of this 18 19 Section.
- Special activities in physical education shall be provided for pupils whose physical or emotional condition, as determined by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, prevents their participation in the courses provided for normal children.
- 25 (b) A school board is authorized to excuse pupils enrolled 26 in grades 11 and 12 from engaging in physical education courses if those pupils request to be excused for any of the following 27 reasons: (1) for ongoing participation in an interscholastic 28 athletic program; (2) to enroll in academic classes which are 29 30 required for admission to an institution of higher learning, provided that failure to take such classes will result in the 31 pupil being denied admission to the institution of his or her 32

1 choice; or (3) to enroll in academic classes which are required 2 for graduation from high school, provided that failure to take 3 such classes will result in the pupil being unable to graduate. A school board may also excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 4 5 enrolled in a marching band program for credit from engaging in physical education courses if those pupils request to be 6 excused for ongoing participation in such marching band 7 8 program. In addition, a school board may excuse pupils in 9 grades 9 through 12 if those pupils must utilize the time set aside for physical education to receive special education 10 11 support and services. A school board may also excuse pupils in 12 grades 9 through 12 enrolled in a Reserve Officer's Training 13 Corps (ROTC) program sponsored by the school district from engaging in physical education courses. A school board may also 14 15 excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 from engaging in physical 16 education courses if the pupil is getting substantial physical 17 activity from participating in athletic training and competition in a sport under the auspices of a national 18 governing board that is recognized by and affiliated with an 19 20 international sports federation and the parent or guardian has provided documentation of such training and recognition. 21 22 School boards which choose to exercise this authority shall 23 establish a policy to excuse pupils on an individual basis.

24 (c) The provisions of this Section are subject to the provisions of Section 27-22.05.
