If a person 7 registered to vote by mail, the person must vote for the first 8 9 time in person and not by an absentee ballot, except that the 10 person may vote by absentee ballot in person if the person 11 first provides the appropriate election authority with sufficient proof of identity by the person's driver's license 12 13 number or State identification card number or, if the person does not have either of those, by the last 4 digits of 14 the 15 person's social security number, a copy of a current and valid 16 photo identification, or a copy of any of the following current 17 documents that show the person's name and address: utility 18 bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or 19 government document.

Sec. 6-105. First time voting. A person must vote for the 2 3 first time in person and not by a mailed absentee ballot if the 4 person registered to vote by mail, unless the person first provides the appropriate election authority with sufficient 5 proof of identity and the election authority verifies the 6 person's proof of identity. Sufficient proof of identity shall 7 8 be demonstrated by submission of the person's driver's license 9 number or State identification card number or, if the person does not have either of those, verification by the last 4 10 digits of the person's social security number, a copy of a 11 12 current and valid photo identification, or a copy of a current 13 document that shows the person's name and address. Persons who 14 apply to register to vote by mail but provide inadequate proof of identity to the election authority shall be notified by the 15 election authority that the registration has not been fully 16 completed and that the person remains ineligible to vote by 17 mail or in person until such proof is presented. If a person 18 19 registered to vote by mail, the person must vote for the first 20 time in person and not by an absentee ballot, except that the 21 person may vote by absentee ballot in person if the person 22 first provides the appropriate election authority with sufficient proof of identity by the person's driver's license 23 24 State identification card number or, if the number <u>or</u> 25 does not have either of those, by the last 4 digits of the
