1 AN ACT concerning criminal law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by changing

 Section 19-2 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/19-2) (from Ch. 38, par. 19-2)
- 7 Sec. 19-2. Possession of burglary tools.
- 8 (a) A person commits the offense of possession of burglary 9 tools when he possesses any key, tool, instrument, device, or

any explosive, suitable for use in breaking into a building,

- 11 housetrailer, watercraft, aircraft, motor vehicle as defined
- in The Illinois Vehicle Code, railroad car, or any depository
- designed for the safekeeping of property, or any part thereof,
- 14 with intent to enter any such place and with intent to commit
- 15 therein a felony or theft. The possession of a key designed for
- 16 <u>lock bumping demonstrates intent to commit a felony or theft.</u>
- For the purposes of this Section, "lock bumping" means a lock
- 18 picking technique for opening a pin tumbler lock using a
- 19 specially-crafted bumpkey.
- 20 (b) Sentence.

- 21 Possession of burglary tools in violation of this Section
- is a Class 4 felony.
