- Section 50. The sum of \$540,800, or so much thereof as 1
- may be necessary, is appropriated from the Reviewing Court 2
- Alternative Dispute Resolution Fund to the Supreme Court for 3
- alternative dispute resolution programs within the reviewing 4
- 5 courts.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 6
- 7 2007.
