SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-610.1 30 ILCS 805/8.32 new

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a person not otherwise prohibited from driving a vehicle on a roadway while using a wireless telephone may do so only if that wireless telephone is specifically designed and configured to allow hands-free operation, and is used in that manner while driving. Provides that any person who violates the provision regarding wireless telephone use shall be fined \$250. Amends the State Mandates Act to require implementation without reimbursement by the State.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY

STATE MANDATES ACT MAY REQUIRE REIMBURSEMENT 1 AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
- 5 Section 12-610.1 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-610.1)
- 7 Sec. 12-610.1. Wireless telephones.
- 8 (a) As used in this Section, "wireless telephone" $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 9 "wireless phone" means a device that is capable of transmitting
- 10 or receiving telephonic communications without a wire
- 11 connecting the device to the telephone network.
- 12 (b) A person under the age of 19 years who holds an
- instruction permit issued under Section 6-105 or 6-107.1, or a
- 14 person under the age of 19 years who holds a graduated license
- issued under Section 6-107, may not drive a vehicle on a
- 16 roadway while using a wireless phone.
- 17 (c) This Section does not apply to any a person under the
- 18 age of 19 years using a wireless telephone for emergency
- 19 purposes, including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a
- law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department,
- or other emergency services agency or entity.
- 22 (d) If a graduated driver's license holder over the age of
- 23 18 committed an offense against traffic regulations governing

- the movement of vehicles or any violation of Section 6-107 or 1 2 Section 12-603.1 of this Code in the 6 months prior to the graduated driver's license holder's 18th birthday, and was 3 4 subsequently convicted of the violation, the provisions of 5 paragraph (b) shall continue to apply until such time as a 6 period of 6 consecutive months has elapsed without an 7 additional violation and subsequent conviction of an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles 8 9 or any violation of Section 6-107 or Section 12-603.1 of this 10 Code.
- 11 (e) A person not subject to subsection (b) of this Section

 12 may not drive a vehicle on a roadway while using a wireless

 13 telephone unless that wireless telephone is specifically

 14 designed and configured to allow hands-free operation, and is

 15 used in that manner while driving.
- (f) A person who violates this Section shall be fined \$250.

- Sec. 8.32. Exempt mandate. Notwithstanding Sections 6 and 8
 of this Act, no reimbursement by the State is required for the
 implementation of any mandate created by this amendatory Act of
