AN ACT concerning education.

2 WHEREAS, The General Assembly finds and declares the 3 following:

4 (a) Illinois has over one million deaf and hard of
5 hearing residents;

6 (b) American Sign Language (ASL) is a fully-developed, 7 visual-gestural language with distinct grammar, syntax, 8 and symbols and is one of hundreds of signed languages in 9 the world;

10 (c) The American deaf community is a group of citizens 11 who are members of a unique culture who share ASL as their 12 common language; and

13 (d) High school graduation requirements under Section 14 27-22 of the School Code require students to take one year 15 of music, art, vocational education, or a foreign language, 16 which includes ASL; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly hereby also declares the purpose and intent of this amendatory Act to be as follows:

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(a) To recognize ASL as the language of the American deaf community; and

(b) To authorize and encourage public and independent schools, including post-secondary schools, to offer ASL as a course of study and to accept ASL credits as foreign-language credits; therefore

(D) 3 years of science (laboratory sciences); and

The Board of 17 of Western Illinois University shall Trustees not University's admissions 18 discriminate in the process 19 against an applicant for admission because of the 20 applicant's enrollment in a charter school established under Article 27A of the School Code. Western Illinois 21 22 University may also admit (i) applicants who did not have 23 an opportunity to complete the minimum college preparatory 24 curriculum in high school, and (ii) educationally 25 disadvantaged applicants who are admitted to the formal 26 organized special assistance programs that are tailored to

the needs of such students, providing that in either case, 1 2 the institution incorporates in the applicant's baccalaureate curriculum 3 courses or other academic activities that compensate for course deficiencies; and 4

5 (3) except that up to 3 of 15 units of coursework 6 required by paragraph (1) of this subsection may be 7 distributed by deducting no more than one unit each from 8 the categories of social studies, mathematics, sciences 9 and electives and completing those 3 units in any of the 5 10 categories of coursework described in paragraph (1).

11 Notwithstanding any other rulemaking authority that may 12 exist, neither the Governor or University nor any agency or 13 agency head under the jurisdiction of the Governor has any 14 authority to make or promulgate rules to implement or enforce the provisions of this amendatory Act of the 95th General 15 Assembly. If, however, the Governor or University believes that 16 17 rules are necessary to implement or enforce the provisions of this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly, the Governor 18 19 or University may suggest rules to the General Assembly by 20 filing them with the Clerk of the House and the Secretary of the Senate and by requesting that the General Assembly 21 22 authorize such rulemaking by law, enact those suggested rules 23 into law, or take any other appropriate action in the General 24 Assembly's discretion. Nothing contained in this amendatory 25 Act of the 95th General Assembly shall be interpreted to grant rulemaking authority under any other <u>Illinois statute where</u> 26

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such authority is not otherwise explicitly given. For the 1 2 purposes of this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly, 3 "rules" is given the meaning contained in Section 1-70 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act, and "agency" and 4 5 "agency head" are given the meanings contained in Sections 1-20 and 1-25 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act to the 6 7 extent that such definitions apply to agencies or agency heads 8 under the jurisdiction of the Governor.

9 (b) When allocating funds, local boards of education shall 10 recognize their obligation to their students to offer the 11 coursework required by subsection (a).

12 (c) A student who has graduated from high school and has 13 scored within the University's accepted range on the ACT or SAT 14 shall not be required to take the high school level General 15 Educational Development (GED) Test as a prerequisite to 16 admission.

Notwithstanding any other rulemaking authority that may 11 exist, neither the Governor nor any agency or agency head under 12 the jurisdiction of the Governor has any authority to make or 13 promulgate rules to implement or enforce the provisions of this 14 amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly.
