SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 689/5 20 ILCS 689/10 20 ILCS 689/27 new 30 ILCS 105/5.708 new

Amends the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Program Act and the State Finance Act. Provides that the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity shall create and operate an E85 Market Expansion Program that provides debit cards, credit cards, E85 coupons, or some other form of negotiable instrument as determined by the Department for \$500 in credit towards the purchase price of E85 fuel purchased within Illinois. Requires program applicants to have purchased a new flexible fuel vehicle within the 12-month period prior to submitting the application to be eligible for the Program. Provides that only one Program grant shall be made to the owner of any vehicle during the life of that vehicle. Creates the E85 Market Expansion Fund. Makes other changes. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Renewable Fuels Development 5 Program Act is amended by changing Sections 5 and 10 and by 6 adding Section 27 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 689/5)

Sec. 5. Findings and State policy. The General Assembly 8 9 recognizes that agriculture is a vital sector of the Illinois economy and that an important growth industry for the Illinois 10 agricultural sector is renewable fuels production. Renewable 11 fuels produced from Illinois agricultural products hold great 12 13 potential for growing the State's economy, reducing our 14 foreign oil supplies, and improving dependence on the environment by reducing harmful emissions from vehicles. 15 16 Illinois is the nation's leading producer of ethanol, a clean, 17 renewable fuel with significant environmental benefits. The General Assembly finds that reliable supplies of renewable 18 19 fuels will be integral to the long term energy security of the United States. The General Assembly declares that it is the 20 21 public policy of the State of Illinois to promote and encourage 22 the production and use of renewable fuels as a means not only to improve air quality in the State and the nation, but also to 23

<u>increase the size of grow</u> the agricultural sector of the Illinois economy. To achieve these public policy objectives, the General Assembly hereby authorizes the creation and implementation of the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Program within the Department.

8 Sec. 10. Definitions. As used in this Act:

9 "Biodiesel" means a renewable diesel fuel derived from10 biomass that is intended for use in diesel engines.

"Biodiesel blend" means a blend of biodiesel with petroleum-based diesel fuel in which the resultant product contains no less than 1% and no more than 99% biodiesel.

14 "Biomass" means non-fossil organic materials that have an 15 intrinsic chemical energy content. "Biomass" includes, but is 16 not limited to, soybean oil, other vegetable oils, and ethanol.

17 "Department" means the Department of Commerce and Economic18 Opportunity.

"Diesel fuel" means any product intended for use or offered for sale as a fuel for engines in which the fuel is injected into the combustion chamber and ignited by pressure without electric spark.

23 "Director" means the Director of Commerce and Economic24 Opportunity.

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"Ethanol" means a product produced from agricultural

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1 commodities or by-products used as a fuel or to be blended with 2 other fuels for use in motor vehicles.

3 "Flexible fuel vehicle" has the meaning set forth in
4 Section 22 of the Alternate Fuels Act.

5 "Fuel" means fuel as defined in Section 1.19 of the Motor6 Fuel Tax Law.

7 "Gasohol" means motor fuel that is no more than 90% 8 gasoline and at least 10% denatured ethanol that contains no 9 more than 1.25% water by weight.

10 "Gasoline" means all products commonly or commercially 11 known or sold as gasoline (including casing head and absorption 12 or natural gasoline).

"Illinois agricultural product" means any agricultural commodity grown in Illinois that is used by a production facility to produce renewable fuel in Illinois, including, but not limited to, corn, barley, and soy beans.

17 "Labor Organization" means any organization defined as a 18 "labor organization" under Section 2 of the National Labor 19 Relations Act (29 U.S.C. 152).

20 "Majority blended ethanol fuel" means motor fuel that 21 contains no less than 70% and no more than 90% denatured 22 ethanol and no less than 10% and no more than 30% gasoline.

23 "Motor vehicles" means motor vehicles as defined in the 24 Illinois Vehicle Code and watercraft propelled by an internal 25 combustion engine.

"Owner" means any individual, sole proprietorship, limited

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partnership, co-partnership, joint venture, corporation, cooperative, or other legal entity, including its agents, that operates or will operate a plant located within the State of Illinois.

5 "Plant" means a production facility that produces a 6 renewable fuel. "Plant" includes land, any building or other 7 improvement on or to land, and any personal properties deemed 8 necessary or suitable for use, whether or not now in existence, 9 in the processing of fuel from agricultural commodities or 10 by-products.

11 "Renewable fuel" means ethanol, gasohol, majority blended 12 ethanol fuel, biodiesel blend fuel, and biodiesel.

16 <u>Sec. 27. E85 Market Expansion Program.</u>

(a) The Department shall, subject to appropriation, create 17 18 and administer the E85 Market Expansion Program. Under this program, the Department must solicit and collect applications 19 20 from persons who have purchased a new flexible fuel vehicle 21 within the 12-month period prior to submitting the application. 22 Approved applicants shall be eligible for Program 23 distributions. 24 (b) The Program shall distribute debit cards, credit cards,

25 E85 coupons, or some other form of negotiable instrument as

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determined by the Department that authorizes the approved applicant \$500 in credit towards the purchase price of E85 fuel purchased within Illinois. Only one distribution shall be made to the owner of any vehicle during the life of that vehicle.

5 <u>(c) The E85 Market Expansion Fund is established as a</u> 6 <u>special fund in the State treasury. Moneys in the Fund may be</u> 7 <u>used, subject to appropriation, only for the purposes set forth</u> 8 <u>in this Section. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund must be</u> 9 <u>deposited into the Fund. The Department may retain 5% of the</u> 10 <u>moneys in the Fund for administrative costs of the Program.</u>

11 (d) The Department shall have access to Secretary of State 12 motor vehicle registration records and other State records to 13 enable verification of these applications.

14 <u>(e) The Department shall adopt necessary rules for the</u> 15 <u>implementation of this Section, including rules for the</u> 16 <u>solicitation, collection, and approval of applications and for</u> 17 <u>the operation of the program distributions.</u>

Section 10. The State Finance Act is amended by adding Section 5.708 as follows:

22 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 23 becoming law.
