## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 6 No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred

- 11 Section 25. The sum of \$489,800, or so much thereof as
- 12 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
- Juvenile Justice from the General Revenue Fund for costs and
- 14 expenses associated with payment of statewide
- 15 hospitalization.
- 16 Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
- 17 1, 2008.
