1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6455

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6455, by deleting
3 everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
4 thereof the following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 95. The sum of \$3,114,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
8 Professions Dedicated Fund to the Department of Financial and
9 Professional Regulation for all costs associated with the
10 development, support or administration of pharmacy practice
11 educational or training programs at institutions of higher
12 education within the State of Illinois.

13 Section 145. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Nursing Dedicated
 2 and Professional Fund to the Department of Financial and
 3 Professional Regulation for the establishment and operation
 4 of an Illinois Center for Nursing.

12 Section 25. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
15 made for such purpose in Article 195, Section 40 of Public
16 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Digital Divide
17 Elimination Infrastructure Fund to the Illinois Commerce
18 Commission for grants and awards for the construction of
19 high-speed data transmission facilities.

20 Section 30. The sum of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation
22 Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for (1)

1 disbursing funds collected for the Single State Insurance
2 Registration Program and/or Unified Carrier Registration
3 System; (2) for refunds for overpayments; and (3) for
4 administrative expenses.

5 Section 35. The sum of \$1,300,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation
7 Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for the
8 costs associated with the implementation of Senate Bill 435,
9 the Illinois Commercial Safety Towing Law. This section is
10 operative only if Senate Bill 435 of the 95th General Assembly
11 becomes law.

12 Section 40. The sum of \$170,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
14 Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for railroad safety
15 and inspection.

16 ARTICLE 4

ARTICLE 5

7 the Illinois National Guard or Illinois residents who are

10 2001 terrorist attacks, including costs in prior years.
