1 ARTICLE 5

Section 40. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as 2 3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Military Family Relief Fund to the Department of Military Affairs 4 5 Office of the Adjutant General Division for the issuance of grants to persons or families of persons who are members of 6 the Illinois National Guard or Illinois residents who are 7 members of the armed forces of the United States and who have 8 9 been called to active duty as a result of the September 11, 10 2001 terrorist attacks, including costs in prior years.

11 ARTICLE 6

Section 5. The following named amount of \$621,300, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Labor for Displaced Homemaker Grants.
