SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Force-Fed Birds Act. Prohibits force-feeding birds and the selling, serving, or dispensing of products that are the result of force-feeding birds. Provides that violation of the Act is a petty offense with a fine of \$1,000.

1 AN ACT concerning animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Force-Fed Birds Act.

- 8 (1) A "bird" includes, but is not limited to, a duck 9 or goose.
 - (2) "Force-feeding a bird" means a process that causes the bird to consume more food than a typical bird of the same species would consume voluntarily. Force-feeding methods include, but are not limited to, delivering feed through a tube or other device inserted into the bird's esophagus.
 - (b) A person may not force-feed a bird for the purpose of enlarging the bird's liver beyond normal size or hire another person to do so.
- 19 (c) A product may not be sold, served, or dispensed in this 20 State if it is the result of force-feeding a bird for the 21 purpose of enlarging the bird's liver beyond normal size.
- 22 (d) A person who knowingly violates this Section is guilty 23 of a petty offense and shall be fined \$1,000. Each day that a

1 violation occurs is a separate offense.
