

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 5

5 ILLINOIS STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

6 Section 5. In addition to any other amounts appropriated  
7 for such purpose, the amount of \$44,386,800, or so much  
8 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the  
9 Education Assistance Fund to the Illinois State Board of  
10 Education for Early Childhood Education for the fiscal year  
11 beginning July 1, 2007.

12 Section 10. In addition to any other amounts  
13 appropriated for such purpose, the amount of \$259,764,700, or  
14 so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the  
15 Education Assistance Fund to the Illinois State Board of  
16 Education for General State Aid for the fiscal year beginning  
17 July 1, 2007.

19 ARTICLE 15

## 1 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

2 Section 10. The amount of \$2,612,500 is appropriated  
3 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of  
4 Agriculture for deposit into the Conservation 2000 Projects  
5 Fund.

6 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or  
7 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations  
8 in Section 10 of this Article until after the purposes and  
9 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

## 11 ARTICLE 25

## 12 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

13 Section 10. The sum of \$77,500,000, or so much thereof  
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal  
15 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
16 Opportunity for all costs associated with the capital  
17 development of coal gasification plants.

18 Section 15. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as  
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital

1 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
2 Opportunity for costs related to preliminary planning,  
3 design, and engineering of a pipeline to transport carbon  
4 dioxide produced at coal gasification facilities for storage  
5 underground.

6 Section 20. The sum of \$100,000,000, or so much thereof  
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
8 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
9 Opportunity for grants, loans, and investments or other  
10 economic development activities associated with the Illinois  
11 Community Assets Fund initiative or other economic  
12 development activities.

13 Section 25. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as  
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
16 Opportunity for all costs associated with the capital  
17 development and construction of biodiesel production  
18 facilities.

19 Section 30. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof  
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
21 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
22 Opportunity for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator

1 Laboratory for the Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

2 Section 35. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof  
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
4 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
5 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for  
6 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

7 Section 40. The sum of \$60,000,000, or so much thereof  
8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
9 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
10 Opportunity for a grant to University of Illinois at  
11 Urbana/Champaign for all costs associated with design and  
12 construction of a Petascale Computing Facility.

13 Section 45. The sum of \$490,000, or so much thereof as  
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
16 Opportunity for a grant to University of Illinois at Chicago  
17 for all costs associated with planning campus improvements.

18 Section 50. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof  
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
20 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
21 Opportunity for grants associated with the capital

1 development of new ethanol production facilities.

2 Section 55. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as  
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
4 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
5 Opportunity for grants associated with adding new E-85 fuel  
6 pumps across the State.

7 Section 60. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as  
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
9 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
10 Opportunity for all costs associated with loans to small  
11 businesses and manufacturers for energy efficiency  
12 investments.

13 Section 65. The sum of \$400,000,000, or so much thereof  
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
16 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to  
17 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,  
18 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and  
19 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other  
20 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the  
21 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for  
22 such purposes.

1 Section 70. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much  
 2 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital  
 3 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
 4 Opportunity for grants to local governments for capital  
 5 improvements to civic centers for the projects hereinafter  
 6 enumerated:

 14 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any  
 15 appropriation herein made in Sections 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35,  
 16 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 65 and 70 of this Article until after the  
 17 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the  
 18 Governor.

21 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

22 Section 45. The sum of \$8,093,204, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
2 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore  
3 made in Article 96, Section 45 of Public Act 94-798, is  
4 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
5 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants  
6 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or  
7 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

8 Section 50. The sum of \$3,130,040, or so much thereof as  
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
10 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore  
11 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 50 of Public Act  
12 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois  
13 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
14 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to  
15 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

16 Section 55. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as  
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
18 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore  
19 made in Article 96, Section 55 of Public Act 94-798, is  
20 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
21 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants  
22 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or  
23 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.



1           Section 60. The sum of \$7,292,122, or so much thereof as  
2           may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
3           business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore  
4           made in Article 96, Section 60 of Public Act 94-798, is  
5           reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
6           Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants  
7           and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or  
8           Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

9           Section 65. The sum of \$5,524,172, or so much thereof as  
10          may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
11          business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore  
12          made in Article 96, Section 65 of Public Act 94-798, is  
13          reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
14          Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants  
15          and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or  
16          Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

17          Section 90. The sum of \$249,979,037, or so much thereof  
18          as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
19          business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore  
20          made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 90 of Public Act  
21          94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund  
22          to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for

1 the purpose of making grants and loans to local governments  
2 for planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,  
3 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the  
4 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized  
5 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act  
6 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

7 Section 95. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof  
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
9 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore  
10 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 95 of Public Act  
11 94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund  
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for  
13 the purpose of fostering economic development and increased  
14 employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois,  
15 and for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of  
16 Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to  
17 State agencies for such purposes.

18 Section 100. The sum of \$48,585,959, or so much thereof  
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
20 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore  
21 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 100 of Public  
22 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond  
23 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity

1 for the development and improvement of educational,  
2 scientific, technical and vocational programs and facilities  
3 and the expansion of health and human services, and for any  
4 other purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of  
5 the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies  
6 for such purposes.

7 Section 105. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof  
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
9 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore  
10 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 105 of Public  
11 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development  
12 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
13 for open spaces, recreational and conservation purposes and  
14 the protection of land and for deposits into the Conservation  
15 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection (c) of Section  
16 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State  
17 agencies for such purposes.

18 Section 110. The sum of \$40,843,544, or so much thereof  
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
20 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore  
21 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 110 of Public  
22 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development  
23 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity

1 for grants to local governments for the acquisition,  
2 financing, architectural planning, development, alteration,  
3 installation, and construction of capital facilities  
4 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and  
5 land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the  
6 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies  
7 for such purposes.

8 Section 155. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much  
9 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the  
10 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation  
11 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 45 of Public Act 94-  
12 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to  
13 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for  
14 grants pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9, or  
15 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

16 Section 170. The sum of \$27,662,869, or so much thereof  
17 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
18 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore  
19 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 115 of Public  
20 Act 94-0798, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois'  
21 Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
22 for grants to units of government, educational facilities and  
23 not-for-profit organizations for education and training,  
24 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects

1 including but not limited to planning, construction,  
2 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all  
3 costs associated with economic development programs,  
4 community service programs, public health programs, public  
5 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for  
6 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating  
7 purposes.

8

9 Section 175. No contract shall be entered into or  
10 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any  
11 appropriation herein made in this Article, until after the  
12 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the  
13 Governor.

16 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

17 GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

18 Section 175. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof  
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital  
20 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
21 the non-federal cost share of a Conservation Reserve  
22 Enhancement Program to establish long-term contracts and

1 permanent conservation easements in the Illinois River Basin;  
 2 to fund cost-share assistance to landowners to encourage  
 3 approved conservation practices in environmentally sensitive  
 4 and highly erodible areas of the Illinois River Basin; and to  
 5 fund the monitoring of long-term improvements of these  
 6 conservation practices as required in the Memorandum of  
 7 Agreement between the State of Illinois and the United States  
 8 Department of Agriculture.

9 Section 180. The sum of \$7,800,000, or so much thereof as  
 10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital  
 11 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
 12 expenditure by the Office of Water Resources for water  
 13 development projects at the approximate cost set forth below:

14 Ashland - Cass County - For  
 15 participation, along with the  
 16 Illinois Department of  
 17 Transportation and the Village  
 18 of Ashland, in construction of  
 19 a drainage structure at Route  
 20 125, and additional stream  
 21 improvements for implementation  
 22 of flood damage reductions in  
 23 the Village of Ashland .....500,000

 2 County - For implementation  
 3 of a flood damage reduction

13 Section 185. The sum of \$10,300,000, or so much thereof  
 14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital  
 15 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
 16 expenditure by the Office of Water Resources for improvements  
 17 needed at State-owned Dams for upgrading and rehabilitation  
 18 of dams, spillways and supporting facilities, including dam  
 19 removals and the required geotechnical investigations,  
 20 preparation of plans and specifications, and the construction  
 21 of the proposed rehabilitation to ensure reduced risk of  
 22 injury to the public.

23 Section 190. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof



1 as may be necessary is appropriated from the Capital  
 2 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
 3 planning, design and construction of ecosystem  
 4 rehabilitation, habitat restoration and associated  
 5 development in cooperation with the U.S. Army Corps of  
 6 Engineers.

7 Section 195. No contract shall be entered into or  
 8 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from  
 9 appropriations herein made in Sections:

10 175, 180, 185, 190

11 of this Article until after the purpose and amount of such  
 12 expenditure has been approved in writing by the Governor.

14 ARTICLE 55

15 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

16 Section 5. The sum of \$750,000,000, or so much thereof  
 17 as may be necessary, for statewide use pursuant to Section  
 18 4(a)(1) of the General Obligation Bond Act, is appropriated  
 19 from the Transportation Bond Series A Fund to the Department  
 20 of Transportation for land acquisition, engineering  
 21 (including environmental studies and archaeological

1 activities and other studies and activities necessary or  
2 appropriate to secure federal participation in the project),  
3 and construction, including reconstruction, extension and  
4 improvement of State highways, arterial highways, roads,  
5 structures separating highways and railroads and bridges and  
6 for purposes allowed or required by Title 23 of the U.S. Code  
7 as provided by law in order to implement a portion of the  
8 Fiscal Year 2008 road improvements program.

9 Section 10. The sum of \$250,000,000, or so much thereof  
10 as may be necessary, pursuant to Section 4(a) of the Build  
11 Illinois Bond Act is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
12 Bond Fund to the Department of Transportation for planning,  
13 engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction,  
14 development, improvement, extension, and all construction  
15 related expenses of the public infrastructure and other  
16 transportation improvement projects which are related to  
17 economic development in the State of Illinois.

18

19 Section 12. The sum of \$250,000,000, or so much thereof  
20 as may be necessary, pursuant to Section 4(a) of the Build  
21 Illinois Bond Act is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Transportation for grants to  
23 counties, municipalities, and road districts for planning,  
24 engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction,

1 development, improvement, extension, and all construction  
 2 related expenses of the public infrastructure and other  
 3 transportation improvement projects which are related to  
 4 economic development in the State of Illinois allocated as  
 5 follows:

6	For the municipalities of the State .....	122,750,000
7	For the counties of the State having	
8	1,000,000 or more inhabitants .....	41,850,000
9	For the counties of the State having less	
10	than 1,000,000 inhabitants .....	45,675,000
11	For the road districts of the State .....	39,725,000

12 Section 15. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof  
 13 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation  
 14 Bond Series B Fund to the Department of Transportation for  
 15 financial assistance to airports pursuant to Section 34 of  
 16 the Illinois Aeronautics Act, as amended, for such purposes  
 17 as are described in that Section and for airport acquisition  
 18 and development pursuant to Section 72 of the Illinois  
 19 Aeronautics Act, as amended, for such purposes as are  
 20 described in that Section.

21 Section 20. The sum of \$200,000,000, or so much thereof  
 22 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation  
 23 Bond Series B Fund to the Department of Transportation for

1 construction costs, making grants, and providing project  
2 assistance to municipalities, special transportation  
3 districts, private non-profit carriers, mass transportation  
4 carriers and the Intercity rail program for the acquisition,  
5 construction, extension, reconstruction, and improvement of  
6 mass transportation facilities, including rapid transit,  
7 intercity rail, bus and other equipment used in connection  
8 therewith, as provided by law, pursuant to Section 4(b)(1) of  
9 the General Obligation Bond Act, as amended. Prior to the  
10 release of the appropriated funds described above, the  
11 Regional Transportation Authority shall submit a capital  
12 program to the Governor that reflects the system needs and  
13 project types in the following order:

- 14 (1) Projects designed to maintain existing system;
- 15 (2) Projects with the goal of enhancing the existing system;
- 16 and
- 17 (3) Projects designed to expand the existing system.

18 Upon determination by the Governor or appointed delegate that  
19 the submitted capital program reflects the prioritization  
20 described above, the Governor shall release said funds to the  
21 Department of Transportation for subsequent availability to  
22 the Regional Transportation Authority.

23

24 Section 25. An amount equal to \$200,000,000, or so much

1 of that amount as may be necessary, payable solely from  
2 transfers from the State Gaming Fund to the General Revenue  
3 Fund pursuant to subsection (b-2) of Section 13 of the  
4 Riverboat and Casino Gambling Act is appropriated from the  
5 General Revenue Fund to the Department of Transportation for  
6 operating assistance grants to the Regional Transportation  
7 Authority and its Service Boards if and only if House Bill  
8 2035 becomes law.

9 Section 35. In addition to any other amounts  
10 appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, an  
11 amount equal to \$20,000,000, or so much of that amount as may  
12 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund  
13 to the Department of Transportation from transfers from the  
14 State Gaming Fund to the General Revenue Fund pursuant to  
15 subsection (b-2) of Section 13 of the Riverboat and Casino  
16 Gambling Act, if and only if House Bill 2035 becomes law, for  
17 operating assistance and capital grants to carriers  
18 enumerated in Article 360, Section 255 of Public Act 95-0348,  
19 allocated to each carrier in proportion to the amount  
20 appropriated to each carrier of the total amount appropriated  
21 under Article 360, Section 255 of Public Act 95-0348.

22 Section 45. In addition to any other amounts  
23 appropriated for such purpose for the fiscal year beginning

1 July 1, 2007, the sum of \$4,000,000 is appropriated from the  
2 General Revenue Fund to the Department of Transportation from  
3 transfers from the State Gaming Fund to the General Revenue  
4 Fund pursuant to subsection (b-2) of Section 13 of the  
5 Riverboat and Casino Gambling Act, if and only if House Bill  
6 2035 becomes law, for operating assistance and capital grants  
7 to the Madison County Mass Transit District.

8 Section 55. In addition to any other amounts  
9 appropriated for such purpose for the fiscal year beginning  
10 July 1, 2007, the amount of \$5,800,000 is appropriated from  
11 the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Transportation  
12 from transfers from the State Gaming Fund to the General  
13 Revenue Fund pursuant to subsection (b-2) of Section 13 of  
14 the Riverboat and Casino Gambling Act, if and only if House  
15 Bill 2035 becomes law, for operating assistance and capital  
16 grants for public transportation services to Bond County;  
17 Bureau County, Coles County; Edgar County; Stephenson County  
18 and the City of Freeport; Henry County; Jo Daviess County;  
19 Kankakee and McLean Counties; Peoria County, Piatt County,  
20 Shelby County, Tazewell and Woodford Counties; Vermillion  
21 County; Williamson County; and Kendall County.

22 Section 60. The sum of \$160,000,000, or so much thereof  
23 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation

1 Bond Series B Fund to the Department of Transportation,  
 2 pursuant to Section 4(b)(1) of the General Obligation Bond  
 3 Act, for track and signal improvements, AMTRAK station  
 4 improvements, rail passenger equipment, and rail freight  
 5 facility improvements.

6 Section 65. No contract shall be entered into or
