1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1110

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 1110 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4

5 "ARTICLE 5

6 ILLINOIS STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

7 Section 5. In addition to any other amounts appropriated
8 for such purpose, the amount of \$44,386,800, or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
10 Education Assistance Fund to the Illinois State Board of
11 Education for Early Childhood Education for the fiscal year
12 beginning July 1, 2007.

13 Section 10. In addition to any other amounts
14 appropriated for such purpose, the amount of \$259,764,700, or

1 so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
2 Education Assistance Fund to the Illinois State Board of
3 Education for General State Aid for the fiscal year beginning
4 July 1, 2007.

5 Total, Article 5 \$304,151,500

6 ARTICLE 6

7 Section 5. This Act supersedes Articles 455, 465, 475,
8 485, 490, 495, 505, 510, 515, 520, 525, 530, 535, 545,
9 550, 555 and 560 of House Bill 3866 of the 95th General
10 Assembly. The amounts of expenditure made under the
11 authority of the Articles are to be disregarded in
12 determining the amounts available for expenditure under this
13 Act, except where specifically stated otherwise in this Act.
14 In the event that expenditures approved by the Comptroller
15 pursuant to the Articles exceed the new appropriation, the
16 appropriation is increased to the amount of those approved
17 expenditures.

18 ARTICLE 10

19 OFFICE OF THE ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

20 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this

1 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
2 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose
3 in Section 5 of Article 92 of Public Act 94-798, is
4 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
5 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
6 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
7 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
8 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is
9 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
10 Building.

11 Section 10. The sum of \$587,367, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
14 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 92 of Public
15 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
16 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
17 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
18 other related expenses, including architectural and
19 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
20 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
21 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

22 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or
23 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations

1 in Section 5 and 10 of this Article until after the purposes
2 and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

4 ARTICLE 15

5 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

6 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
7 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the
8 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
9 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
10 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
11 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
12 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

13 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

14 For various projects at the State

15 Fairgrounds 600,000

16 For various projects at the DuQuoin State

17 Fairgrounds 225,000

18 Total \$825,000

19 Section 10. The amount of \$2,612,500 is appropriated
20 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of
21 Agriculture for deposit into the Conservation 2000 Projects

1 Fund.

2 Section 15. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Conservation
4 2000 Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture for the
5 Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

6 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
7 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
8 in Section 10 of this Article until after the purposes and
9 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

10 Total, Article 15 \$6,050,000

11 ARTICLE 20

12 DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

13 Section 5. The sum of \$9,824,959, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in Article 94, Section 5 of Public Act
17 94-0798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
18 to the Department of Central Management Services for
19 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but
20 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

1 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
2 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
3 in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and
4 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

5 Total, Article 20 \$9,824,959

6 ARTICLE 25

7 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

8 Section 5. The amount of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port
10 Development Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce
11 and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with
12 the Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30
13 ILCS 750/9-11.

14 Section 10. The sum of \$77,500,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
16 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for all costs associated with the capital
18 development of coal gasification plants.

19 Section 15. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
2 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
3 Opportunity for costs related to preliminary planning,
4 design, and engineering of a pipeline to transport carbon
5 dioxide produced at coal gasification facilities for storage
6 underground.

7 Section 20. The sum of \$100,000,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
9 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
10 Opportunity for grants, loans, and investments associated
11 with the Illinois Community Assets Fund initiative.

12 Section 25. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
14 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
15 Opportunity for all costs associated with the capital
16 development and construction of biodiesel production
17 facilities.

18 Section 30. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
20 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
21 Opportunity for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator
22 Laboratory for the Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

1 Section 35. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
5 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

6 Section 40. The sum of \$60,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
8 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for a grant to University of Illinois at
10 Urbana/Champaign for all costs associated with design and
11 construction of a Petascale Computing Facility.

12 Section 45. The sum of \$490,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
14 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
15 Opportunity for a grant to University of Illinois at Chicago
16 for all costs associated with planning campus improvements.

17 Section 50. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
19 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
20 Opportunity for grants associated with the capital
21 development of new ethanol production facilities.

1 Section 55. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for grants associated with adding new E-85 fuel
5 pumps across that state.

6 Section 60. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
8 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for all costs associated with loans to small
10 businesses and manufacturers for energy efficiency
11 investments.

12 Section 65. The sum of \$400,000,000, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
14 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
15 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to
16 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
17 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
18 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
19 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the
20 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for
21 such purposes.

1 Section 85. No contract shall be entered into or
2 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
3 appropriation herein made in Sections 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35,
4 40, 45, 50, 55, 60 and 65 of this Article until after the
5 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
6 Governor.

8 ARTICLE 30

9 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

10 Section 10. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
13 made in Article 96, Section 10 of Public Act 94-798, is
14 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
15 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
16 for planning, design, construction, and all other costs
17 associated with a new Ford Technical Training Center.

18 Section 30. The sum of \$3,360,199, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made in Article 96, Section 30 of Public Act 94-798, is

1 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
2 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for Coal
3 Development Programs.

4 Section 35. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
7 made in Article 96, Section 35 of Public Act 94-798, is
8 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
9 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
10 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

11 Section 45. The sum of \$8,093,204, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
14 made in Article 96, Section 45 of Public Act 94-798, is
15 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
16 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
17 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
18 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

19 Section 50. The sum of \$3,130,040, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
22 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 50 of Public Act

1 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
2 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
3 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
4 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

5 Section 55. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 96, Section 55 of Public Act 94-798, is
9 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
10 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
11 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
12 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

13 Section 60. The sum of \$7,292,122, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made in Article 96, Section 60 of Public Act 94-798, is
17 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
18 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
19 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
20 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

21 Section 65. The sum of \$5,524,172, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made in Article 96, Section 65 of Public Act 94-798, is
3 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
4 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
5 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
6 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

7 Section 70. The sum of \$3,975,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made in Article 96, Section 70 of Public Act 94-798, is
11 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
12 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
13 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

14 Section 75. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
17 made in Article 96, Section 75 of Public Act 94-798, is
18 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
19 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
20 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope
21 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. This
22 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other
23 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these

1 purposes.

2 Section 90. The sum of \$249,979,037, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 90 of Public Act
6 94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 the purpose of making grants and loans to local governments
9 for planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
10 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
11 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
12 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
13 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

14 Section 95. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
17 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 95 of Public Act
18 94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
19 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
20 the purpose of fostering economic development and increased
21 employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois,
22 and for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of
23 Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to

1 State agencies for such purposes.

2 Section 100. The sum of \$48,585,959, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 100 of Public
6 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
8 for the development and improvement of educational,
9 scientific, technical and vocational programs and facilities
10 and the expansion of health and human services, and for any
11 other purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of
12 the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies
13 for such purposes.

14 Section 105. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
17 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 105 of Public
18 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
19 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
20 for open spaces, recreational and conservation purposes and
21 the protection of land and for deposits into the Conservation
22 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection (c) of Section
23 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State

1 agencies for such purposes.

2 Section 110. The sum of \$40,843,544, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 110 of Public
6 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
8 for grants to local governments for the acquisition,
9 financing, architectural planning, development, alteration,
10 installation, and construction of capital facilities
11 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
12 land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the
13 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies
14 for such purposes.

15 Section 120. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
17 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
18 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 10 of Public Act 94-
19 798, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
20 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
21 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
22 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
23 technical planning and installation of capital facilities

1 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
2 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
3 within the State.

4 Section 125. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much
5 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
6 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
7 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 15 of Public Act 94-
8 798, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
9 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
10 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
11 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
12 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
13 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
14 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
15 within the State, including but not limited to a grant for a
16 commercial scale project that produces electric power and
17 hydrogen and demonstrates underground storage of up to 1
18 million metric tons annually of carbon dioxide.

19 Section 130. The amount of \$10,000,000, or so much
20 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
21 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
22 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 20 of Public Act 94-
23 798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to

1 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
2 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
3 architectural planning, development, alteration,
4 installation, and construction of capital facilities
5 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
6 land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the
7 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies
8 for such purposes.

9 Section 135. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
11 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
12 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 25 of Public Act 94-
13 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
14 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
15 grant to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
16 Crystallization Facility

17 Section 140. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
18 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
19 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
20 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 30 of Public Act 94-
21 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
22 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
23 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

1 Section 145. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much
2 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
3 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
4 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 35 of Public Act 94-
5 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
6 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
7 grant to the Illinois Institute of Technology for the
8 biomedical research complex.

9 Section 150. The amount of \$3,000,000, or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
11 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
12 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 40 of Public Act 94-
13 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
14 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
15 grant to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory for the
16 Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

17 Section 155. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
18 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
19 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
20 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 45 of Public Act 94-
21 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
22 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for

1 grants pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9, or
2 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

3 Section 160. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much
4 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
5 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
6 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 50 of Public Act 94-
7 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
8 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
9 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels
10 Development Act.

11 Section 165. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
12 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
13 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
14 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 55 of Public Act 94-
15 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
16 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
17 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

18 Section 170. No contract shall be entered into or
19 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
20 appropriation herein made in this Article, except Section
21 175, until after the purpose and amounts have been approved
22 in writing by the Governor.

1 Section 175. The sum of \$27,662,869, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 115 of Public
5 Act 94-0798, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois'
6 Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
7 for grants to units of government, educational facilities and
8 not-for-profit organizations for education and training,
9 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects
10 including but not limited to planning, construction,
11 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
12 costs associated with economic development programs,
13 community service programs, public health programs, public
14 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
15 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
16 purposes.

18 ARTICLE 35

19 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

20 GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

21 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
2 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
3 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
4 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
5 boat access areas.

6 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
8 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes
9 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
10 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
11 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
12 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
13 areas.

14 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including
15 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
16 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
17 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
18 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
19 construction and development of facilities for transient,
20 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
21 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
22 Grant Program.

1 Section 25. The sum of \$150,000, new appropriation, is
 2 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
 3 Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
 4 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the
 5 Agency's operational expenses.

6 Section 30. The following named sums, new appropriations,
 7 or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the
 8 objects and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to
 9 the Department of Natural Resources:

10 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

11 For multiple use facilities and
 12 programs for boating purposes
 13 provided by the Department of Natural
 14 Resources, including construction
 15 and development, all costs for supplies,
 16 materials, labor, land acquisition,
 17 services, studies and all other
 18 expenses required to comply with the
 19 intent of this appropriation1,200,000

20 Payable from State Parks Fund:

21 For multiple use facilities and programs
 22 for park and trail purposes provided by
