1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2875 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend Senate Bill 2875 on page 1, 2 3 line 12, by deleting "adopt rules to"; and on page 1, immediately below line 22, by inserting the 4 5 following: 6 "Notwithstanding any other rulemaking authority that may 7 exist, neither the Governor nor any agency or agency head under the jurisdiction of the Governor has any authority to make or 8 promulgate rules to implement or enforce the provisions of this 9 amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly. If, however, the 10 11 Governor believes that rules are necessary to implement or enforce the provisions of this amendatory Act of the 95th 12 13 General Assembly, the Governor may suggest rules to the General 14 Assembly by filing them with the Clerk of the House and the 15 Secretary of the Senate and by requesting that the General 16 Assembly authorize such rulemaking by law, enact those

suggested rules into law, or take any other appropriate action

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- in the General Assembly's discretion. Nothing contained in this 1 amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly shall be 2 interpreted to grant rulemaking authority under any other 3 4 Illinois statute where such authority is not otherwise 5 explicitly given. For the purposes of this paragraph, "rules" 6 is given the meaning contained in Section 1-70 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act, and "agency" and "agency head" 7 are given the meanings contained in Sections 1-20 and 1-25 of 8 9 the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act to the extent that 10 such definitions apply to agencies or agency heads under the jurisdiction of the Governor."; and 11
- on page 13, immediately below line 10, by inserting the 12 13 following:
- "(h) Notwithstanding any other rulemaking authority that 15 may exist, neither the Governor nor any agency or agency head under the jurisdiction of the Governor has any authority to make or promulgate rules to implement or enforce the provisions 17 of this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly. If, however, the Governor believes that rules are necessary to implement or enforce the provisions of this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly, the Governor may suggest rules to the General Assembly by filing them with the Clerk of the House and the Secretary of the Senate and by requesting that the General Assembly authorize such rulemaking by law, enact those suggested rules into law, or take any other appropriate action 25

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on page 13, immediately below line 19, by inserting the following:
