SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes supplemental appropriations to the State Board of Elections for its fiscal year 2009 ordinary and contingent expenses. Effective immediately.

Section 5. "An Act concerning appropriations", Public Act
95-734, item reduction vetoed July 10, 2008, is amended by
