5 WHEREAS, Frederick Uhlig was born on December 30, 1946 in 6 Peoria; he was the son of Henry "Pop" and Ruth (McDowell) 7 Uhlig; and

8 WHEREAS, Frederick Uhlig was a 1964 graduate of Richwoods 9 High School in Peoria; after graduation, he enlisted in the 10 United States Marine Corps in June 1964; he served in the 11 Vietnam War and was honorably discharged in 1968; and

WHEREAS, In 1970, Frederick Uhlig graduated from Sangamon State College in Springfield with a degree in Political Science, which led him into a career with the State of Illinois, where he served as a legislative liaison, the deputy director of the Department of Transportation, and deputy director of the Department of Public Health; he later obtained his M.B.A. from Harvard University; he worked as a regional health officer for the Illinois Department of Public Health at the time of his passing; and

WHEREAS, Frederick Uhlig served as a political adviser to

- 6 WHEREAS, Frederick Uhliq enjoyed playing his guitar for a

- 8 restoring and rebuilding British MGs; he loved New Orleans,
- 9 Jimmy Buffett, karaoke, and being with friends; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Frederick Uhliq was preceded in death by his

- 12 WHEREAS, Frederick Uhlig is survived by his son, Brent
- 13 Uhlig; his half brothers, William Diez and Charles Diez; his
- half sister, Beverly; his cousin, Susan Uhlig; and his special
