### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/10-21.11

from Ch. 122, par. 10-21.11

Amends the School Code. Requires school boards, prior to the 2010-2011 school year, to develop policies and adopt rules relating to the prevention of infections transmitted by contact with blood or bodily fluids. Sets forth what the policies and rules must include. Provides that no school shall be required to pay the cost of any testing recommended under these policies and rules. Requires the State Board of Education, in consultation with the Department of Public Health, to develop and disseminate to school boards a model exposure policy and training program, which shall be made available at no cost to schools by video, electronic, or other means. Effective July 1, 2009.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
10-21.11 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/10-21.11) (from Ch. 122, par. 10-21.11)

Sec. 10-21.11. Infectious disease policies and rules.

(a) To develop policies and adopt rules relating to the 8 9 appropriate manner of managing children with chronic 10 diseases, not inconsistent with infectious quidelines published by the State Board of Education and the Illinois 11 Department of Public Health. Such policies and rules must 12 include evaluation of students with a chronic infectious 13 14 disease on an individual case-by-case basis, and may include different provisions for different age groups, classes of 15 instruction, types of educational institution, and other 16 17 reasonable classifications, as the school board may find 18 appropriate.

19 (b) Prior to the 2010-2011 school year, to develop policies 20 and adopt rules relating to the prevention of infections 21 transmitted by contact with blood or bodily fluids. 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blood or bodily fluids occurs; a recommendation for testing by 1 2 a health care professional; and a summary of applicable State and federal laws applying to confidentiality of medical 3 information. No school shall be required to pay the cost of any 4 5 testing recommended under these policies and rules. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the Department of 6 7 Public Health, shall develop and disseminate to school boards a model exposure policy and training program, which shall be made 8 9 available at no cost to schools by video, electronic, or other 10 means.

11 (c) The requirements of this Section apply This requirement 12 applies to all school districts and public schools of this 13 State, including special charter districts, Department of 14 Corrections school districts, laboratory schools operated by 15 the governing board of a public university, and alternative 16 schools operated by a regional superintendent of schools. 17 (Source: P.A. 86-890; 86-1028.)
